Art Classes Slated In Oil Painting

The spring schedule for Maggie Karl's classes in oil painting have been announced by Maurice Romig, South Western Oregon College registrar.

Romig points out that the popular oil painting class taught by Mrs. Karl will be offered in three sections to accommodate the anticipated enrollment.

Classes will be held in the Reedsport High school and in the library of the East Branch building of Marshfield High school.

The classes in Reedsport will be held from 7 to 10 p.m. on Wednesday evenings and in the East Branch library from 7 to 10 p.m. on Thursday evenings and from 9 to 11:50 a.m. on Fridays.

Mrs. Karl, in outlining equipment needed to take this course, mentioned: paints—one each of alizarin crimson, sepia, Windsor blue, cadmium light yellow, phthaline green, and titanium white; a palette knife; one 1-inch brush and one 1/2-inch brush; rags; an 18x24 canvas board; solvent; a large paper palette; an 8 1/2x11 sketching pad; and large sheets of news print.

An exhibition of work done by Mrs. Karl's students is being shown at the Timber Inn and will run until about March 20, when a new showing consisting of water colors done by classes just completing the water color course will be open to the public.
