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Re-upholstery Class Starts Aug. 16 at SWOC

South Western Oregon College, Technical - Vocational Division, is again offering a two-week session in Furniture Re-Upholstery scheduled to begin Aug. 5, in Room 4 of Michigan Avenue School. The course will run until Aug. 16.

Mrs. Mae Frye, popular and well-known instructor, will conduct the course. Mrs. Frye has taught for many years in the Eugene Technical-Vocational School and has experience in the commercial shops of Eugene. This is the sixth consecutive summer she has conducted a class in this area.

Two sections of Furniture Re-Upholstery will be offered. Section One will be held from 1 to 4 p.m.; Section Two from 7 to 10 p.m.

Students are requested to provide a piece of furniture to re-upholster, and the necessary materials. Mrs. Frye will have special items needed and will be able to assist in procurement of material as required.

Furniture pieces may be delivered to the classroom Friday, Aug. 2, from 6 to 7:30 p.m.; Saturday, Aug. 3, from 10 to 12 noon; and on Monday, Aug. 5, from 8 to 12 noon, and 6 to 7 p.m. Cars and trucks should drive to the rear entrance of the east wing of the Michigan Avenue School in Empire for convenient delivery of furniture.

Each student is requested to bring a hammer, pliers, and a sturdy screwdriver. Sissors and a tack hammer would also be useful.

This class is not intended to train professional upholsterers. It is designed to provide the homemaker with information and supervised practice in actually re-upholstering a furniture piece.

The use of hand tools, methods of removing upholstery, alterations and repair of furniture frame, spring reconditioning, and upholstery processes are included.

Registration may be completed by visiting the College Administration Building located on Colorado Street, North Bend, before the session. Further information may be obtained by calling 745-4121.

The fee for the two-week session of 30 hours is \$12.00.

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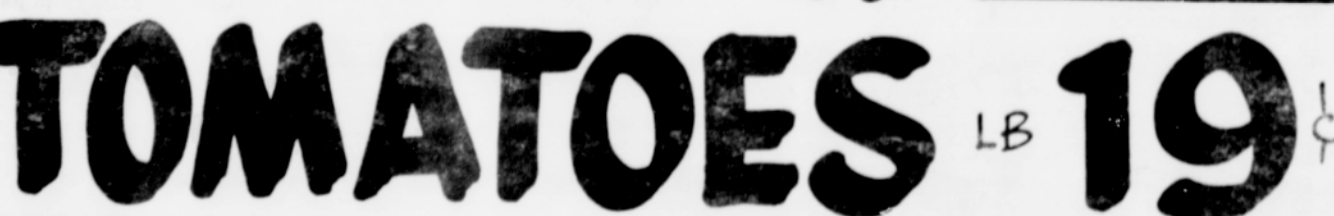
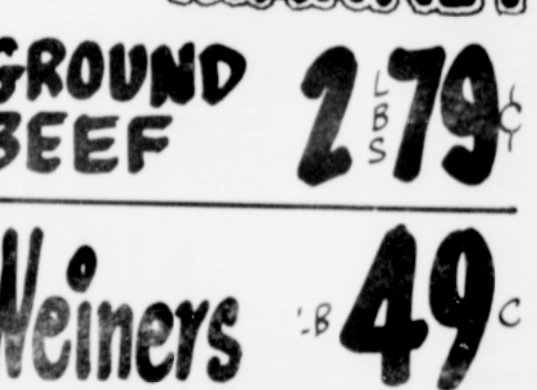
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
