**WORK SMARTER**

DO YOU KNOW that 58% of Oregon brides married for the first time are teenagers? This is about 10% above the national average.

**MOTHS WILL LIKELY PICNIC** on your stow-away woollens this summer unless you adequately discourage them.

You can now buy special preparations containing DDT which can be used on washable woollens. This way mothproofing is combined with washing, either by hand or in the machine, and leaves no odor in the clothes.

Be sure to follow directions on the package—and make certain the garment is washable. If the mothproofing product gets on your skin, wash it off promptly with soap and water. Wear rubber gloves if you put your hands in the wash water. Another precaution—treat an infant's sweater or blanket only if it is to be stored. When you are ready to use it again have it drycleaned first.

Woollens that can't be washed should be drycleaned, hung on an outdoor line and sprayed with a mothproofing chemical. Let them dry, then store. If you put on too much spray there'll be a white deposit after the fabric dries. Don't worry, it will usually brush off after storage.

A good storage spot for bottles, baby foods, sterilizer is the cabinet shelf between the range all these items, large and small, and refrigerator or sink. Group on a lazy susan you can twirl around to reach easily what you want.
