Sweet Violets
During the summer, be sure your African violets have sufficient humidity. To do this, set each in an inch or so of pebbles in an aluminum tray or saucer. Water the tray or saucer to the top of the pebbles and evaporation will do the rest. Also remember, African violets prefer sun filtered through a window screen or light net curtain.

Spice CABINET

Banana Treat
