off return by Dewey Kiefer in the third period to get the Tigers untracked.

The Tigers, in defeating the Pirates for the seventh straight time to run their season's mark to 4-1, held a slim 13-12 lead when Kiefer got away.

The 162-pound junior halfback tucked in the boot from Pacific's second touchdown for a 94-yard gallop down the sidelines while his mates mowed down the defenders. The 94-yarder broke the 37-year-old

record kickoff runback of 90 yards by Powell Lancaster against Marshfield in 1927.

Bandon had control of the game after that. Dave Howard's pass interception paved the way for an insurance touchdown later in the third quarter. A 21-yard run by Kiefer set up a four-yard scoring toss from Bill Smith to Nest Kiefer. The drive covered 33 yards altogether.

The Tigers threatened twice in the fourth quarter. However, Pacific's Scott McDonald void-

ed one at the 11 with an interception and the Pirates recovered a fumble to nullify the other drive.

Bill Barger's recovery of the Pacific mascot set the stage for Bandon's first touchdown, a nine-yard by Howard to cap a 25-yard drive.

Pacific bounced back to tie the score in 10 plays on a 50-yard march which John Johnson climaxed with a three-yard plunge. The Tigers, after repulsing

Pacific on the Bandon-18, went 82 yards in four plays — highlighted by Dewey Kiefer's 43-yard sprint — to grab a 13-6 halftime lead. Rex Nuttbrock tallied on a 17-yard run.

Pacific made it 13-12 in the third period as Johnson's second touchdown, from the one, completed a 56-yard drive in nine plays in which Carl Lang contributed 13 yards and the Pirates benefited from a 15-yard foul.
