Food Marketing Report Calls For More Federal Authority

The long-awaited report of the National Commission on Food Marketing was released June 12. Charles B. Shuman, president of the American Farm Bureau Federation, made the following comments on the mission's report.

Screens Save Young Fish

Low stream flows throughout much of Oregon and utilization of much of this water for irrigation is making it difficult this year for young salmon and steelhead to make their way to the sea. This is the report from game commission fishery biologists in several districts who report rotary fish screens installed on irrigation canals and diversions have blocked thousands of the young migrants from entering what would have resulted in certain death.
