Daniel Hager is the new minister of the Port Orford Community Church. He will speak Sunday at the regular morning service.

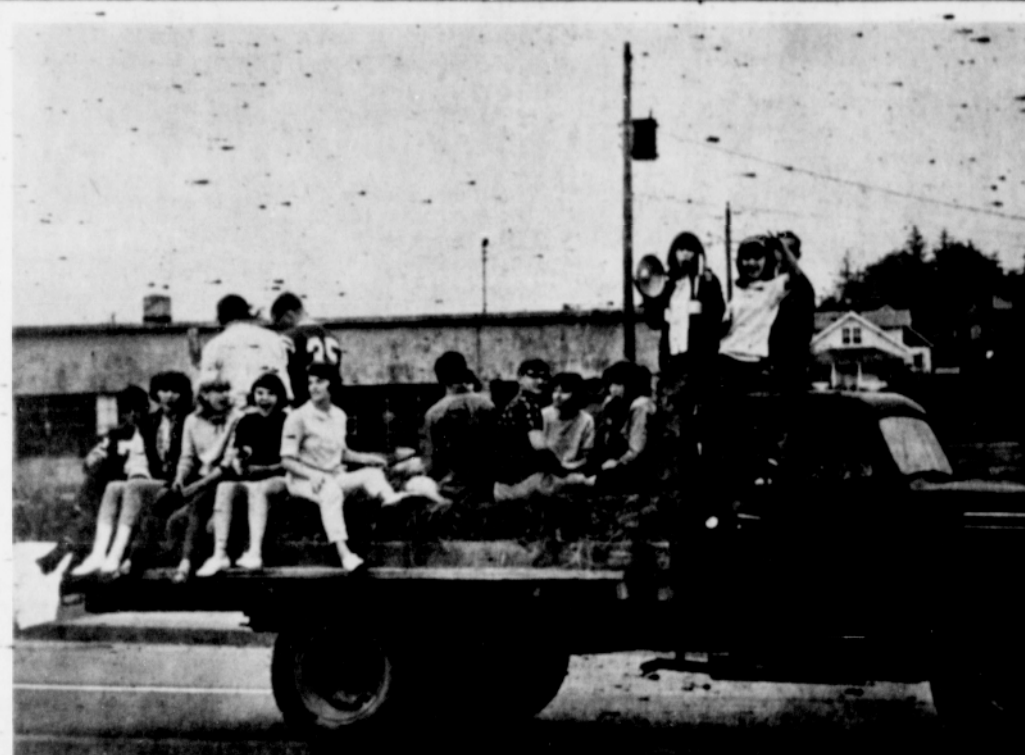
