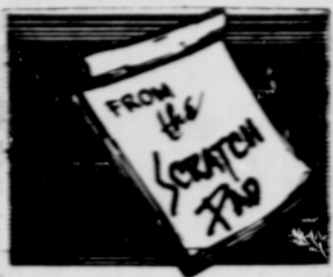
Move It On Over . . .
