Water Pollution Control Important

The State of Alaska has filed in U. S. District Court in Juneau a \$200,000 damage suit against Globe Seaways, Inc. of New York. The suit involves alleged discharge of oil-laden ballast into Cook Inlet near Homer from the 735 foot tanker Rebecca. Captain E. C. Johnson was released on \$1,000 bail after pleading innocent to a criminal charge stemming from the incident. The vessel was to be held until the litigation is settled or until the ship's owner produce a \$400,000 bond.

THERMAL THREAT
Oregon Fish Commission chairman Edward G. Huffman has given the agency's full support for the State Sanitary Authority's policy to require adequate treatment of waste heat at all thermal electric power plants constructed on Oregon inland waters. According to a Sanitary Authority policy statement issued in Portland recently, cooling facilities will be required if thermal power plants are to be operated within the limits prescribed by Oregon's new water quality standards, which call for the highest and best practical treatment and control of wastes. State and federal fisheries agencies have expressed concern about the potential damages to aquatic life that could occur as a result of discharging large quantities of heated water from thermal power plants in Oregon's rivers.

TROUT NOT DISTURBED
Evidently, the trout which frequent the spots where the otter and I share the fishing water together, are not disturbed by the presence of the otter. Evidence of this is very apparent as quite frequently trout rise to a fly that is cast within a short distance of my sleek furred friend. While it is true that otter take toll of game fish, at the same time, such fish has been their food for centuries and long before the coming of man. I am always willing to share the trout of any stream with them. For, after all, why be hogish to the extent of wishing to see all animals and birds that prey on both game and fish, eliminated from the picture?

One Out of Ten Have Accident

One out of every 10 Oregon drivers was involved in a traffic accident during 1967, the Oregon Traffic Safety Commission reported today.

Nearly 125,000 drivers had an accident on state highways, with drivers under age 25 accounting for over 30 per cent of the accidents, although this age group comprises only 20 per cent of the driving population.

Drivers aged 35 to 44 appear to be the safest drivers because they account for 20 per cent of licensed drivers, yet were involved in only 15 per cent of total reported accidents. Drivers aged 75 and over were also disproportionately involved in fatal accidents, said the Commission. This age group is 2.5 per cent of total drivers, yet were involved in 3.4 per cent of fatal accidents.

The question of male versus female driver is also answered by last year's accident figures. Male drivers were involved in 70 per cent of all accidents and 84 per cent of fatal accidents. In all fairness, says the Oregon Traffic Safety Com-

Coquille Man is Drag Winner

Sunday found more than 1500 drag fans lining the Sixes Strip to watch the opening drag race of the 1968 season, sponsored by Southwestern Oregon Timing Association. Over a hundred cars crossed the starting line with the main attraction of the day being the outcome of the pure stock elimination and the presentation of the coveted trophy.

Ray Miller of Coquille took home the honors both as pure stock eliminator and as F stock trophy winner with his 1966 Oldsmobile. To enter a car as a pure stocker it has to be a standard stock car just as it was when it was driven off the show room floor: tires, pipes, plugs, etc. For pure stock eliminator, Miller faced the winner of each of the pure stock classes.

The featured match race event of the day were races between Jim Guy of Sacramento, Calif., in his supercharged 472 cubic inch Chrysler dragster and Jim Haas of Redding, Calif., with his supercharged 500 cubic inch Chevy dragster. They put on a real wood show for the spectators.

LOCAL TROPHY WINNERS

Trophies received by local cars went to Lee Hendrickson who entered his 1968 Chevrolet in the A pure stock class and whose top run was a 13.58 elapsed time with 102.62 miles per hour. Chris Clausen took the honors home for F stock in his 1965 Ford Mustang with a 14.54 e.t. and 98.81 mph. Ron Johnson's 1958 Chevy station wagon breezed by a new "Caddy" for the trophy in N stock automatic with an e.t. of 17.07 and 82.94 mph. David Dornath's Q/stock Ford Falcon took honors in that class.

THE ORGANIZATION
SWOTA is an organization comprised of drag enthusiasts from throughout southwestern Oregon. Their sole function is to organize and supervise drag racing at Western Oregon Dragway (better known as the Sixes Auxiliary Air Strip), eight miles north of Port Orford for the enjoyment of racers and drag fans from all over the northwest. This is one of the few quarter-mile strips in the northwest and it is sanctioned by the National Hot Rod Association.

Hendrickson is president of the association this year, with Dennis Chesselet serving as secretary-treasurer, and Ron Knox as strip manager.

A new tower was built for this year's drags with the hope that it would help to smooth out some of the problems that were encountered in past seasons. One of the new features was that the elapsed time boards and time slips were handled through the lower section of the tower with an E.T. Slip board outside the tower with each car's number listed in numeric order. The E.T. slips were posted there as soon as each run was completed for the pit men or drivers to pick up when ever they wanted to. In the past a car was used to keep the E. T. records and slips where there was not sufficient room to use a number board, and subsequently if a driver did not immediately pick up his slips they were destroyed in all the traffic around the car.

SUMMER SCHEDULE
The summer schedule for Western Oregon Dragway follows: Drag races July 21, Aug. 18 and the SWOTA Jacket Championship races, Sept. 22 (jackets will be awarded as prizes in championship brackets instead of the customary trophies). Race dates for all races will be the following Sunday.
