I am Ellis Foster, your Republican Candidate for County Commissioner. I am seeking this position because I feel I am better qualified than my opponent. By cutting some county budgets a little and the road budget a lot, there would be considerable OGC money available as a school tax offset. I am not in favor of building a new jail facility at this time.

More Than Half Had Been Drinking

More than 52 per cent of the drivers killed and 50 1/2 per cent of all traffic victims in Oregon last year probably had been drinking before the fatal crash.

The Oregon Motor Vehicles Division said Friday its estimate of the drinking driver problem was based on blood alcohol tests given to nearly 48 per cent of the drivers killed and 36 per cent of all Oregon traffic victims in 1969.

Tests were given by medical examiners and results provided for correlation with traffic fatalities reported to that agency. The Division said 177 of 371 drivers killed in traffic were tested for alcohol in the blood. Forty-five per cent of them had readings of .10 or more. This is the level at which traffic and medical authorities are convinced that drivers definitely have impaired driving ability although Oregon law, and that of all but 25 states, places the legal level for intoxication at .15.

Six per cent of the tested drivers had readings between .05 and .09 and one per cent had readings below .05.

The Division said the percentage of drivers tested with readings above .15 decreased eight per cent last year in comparison with 1968, and the percentage with readings in the .01 to .14 range increased nearly three per cent.

Even so, 20 per cent of the deceased drivers had readings of .20 or more and another 13 1/2 per cent had readings between .15 and .19. Most social drinkers would be "under the table" after consuming enough drinks to bring the blood alcohol test to these levels, officials said.
