Community Action Center Activities

Members of the local Community Action Center are striving to acquaint the local residents of the need of local volunteers and to take action in seeking solutions to the existing poverty problems. The agency, employing local people, administers and directs various programs and projects using funds supplied basically by the Office of Economic Opportunity. When funds are available, grants are also obtained from Health, Education, and Welfare, the Labor Department, and Housing and Urban Development Department.

Community Action is a self-help program. They do not give

money away. Funds are spent on people and programs and not fancy equipment and expensive buildings. The agency is administered by a governing board of directors made up of low income representatives, public officials, and private groups and interests.

In the Port Orford area, projects consist of summer camping, emergency food and medical services, and a community center. The camp, free to low income children, provides a summer of fun for children from all over southwestern Oregon. The camp is located on the Sixes River some six miles north of Port Orford on Dry Creek. Through a special program, emergency food and medical services is delivered to eligible low income families in the area. Deliveries are made especially to elderly citizens and families who cannot transport their commodities from the county distribution center in Gold Beach.

Activities include sewing classes for low income women as well as cooking classes which are held every Tuesday morning at 10 a.m. to help people understand and make better use

of abundant food commodities. Other classes have centered around hobbies, arts, and crafts. The center is also a clearing house for information of interest to low income persons as to their rights and existing services aimed at helping the low income group. These activities are monitored by a representative group of local citizens known as the Area Council. The council, made up of 15 to 20 people, including low income representatives, analyze the needs of the poor and conditions of poverty in the low area, and set priorities for projects. Their last meeting was held Wednesday, Oct. 20. This Area Council also acts as a spokesman for low income people in the community.

The center also takes donations of used clothing and household goods making them available to low-income families. They are presently in need of electric stoves, baby cribs, and work shoes.
