ANNUAL TURKEY DINNER SCHEDULED

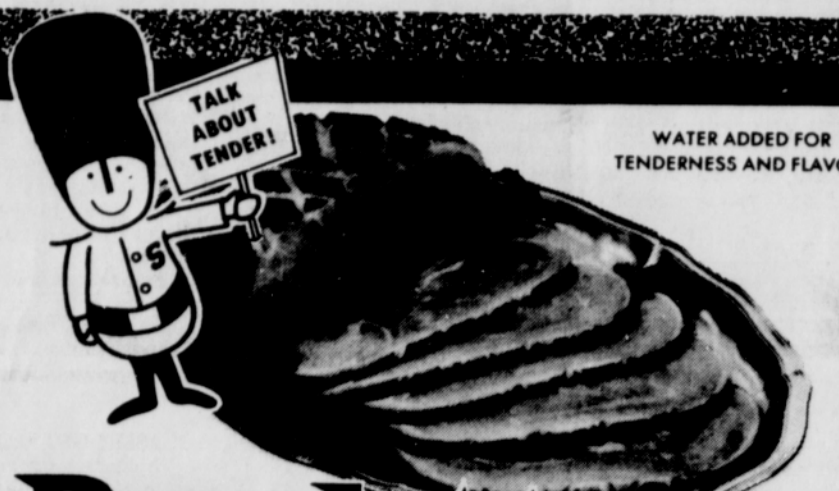
