## Home Food Processing Under New Regulations

When food is processed in a domestic kitchen for sale to the public, persons allowed in the kitchen at the time of processing, preparation, packaging or handling of the commercial foods will be limited to the licensee and those working on the product directly under the supervision of the licensee.

This is only one of the requirements in regulations covering processing of commercial foods in domestic kitchens that became effective September 15.

The regulations further require that: All domestic kitchen doors or openings to other rooms or structures be kept closed and that no other domestic activities of any kind be carried on in the kitchen while the commercial food is being processed, prepared, packaged or handled. No pets be allowed, at any time, in the structure or building in which the domestic kitchen is located. There be separate storage space for ingredients, the finished product, containers and labels for commercial foods. Household cleaning materials, other chemicals or toxic substances or medical supplies not be stored in the domestic kitchen. The regulations also require that licensed operations be
