Traditional Indian dances, singing and games occupied much of the time.

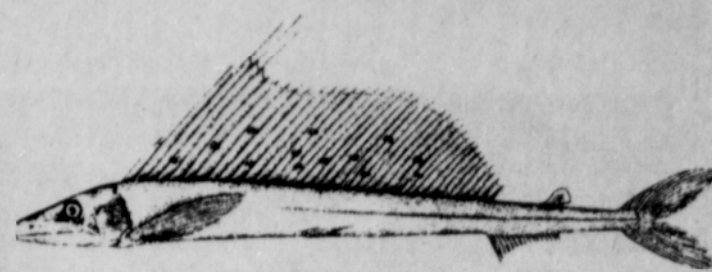

Beachcombers May Find Strange Fish

Tourists and native Oregonians alike may be startled by the bizarre appearance of the Pacific Lancetfish which are currently being washed ashore along the Oregon Coast. Excited by the streamlined body and extraordinary fins, interested people place many calls to offices of the Fish Commission of Oregon seeking information on this uncommon denizen of the briny deep. The Pacific Lancetfish, also

called the Longnose Lancetfish, has a long slender body, about 4-5 feet in length, with a large graceful dorsal fin that looks like a sail. A menacing touch is added by the long fang-like teeth protruding from a pointed mouth. The teeth are sharp and people finding this fish in a weak, but alive, state are cautioned to handle it with care.

To aid in life history studies of this unique fish, the Fish Commission would appreciate receiving any specimens found by people combing Oregon beaches.

Del Skeesick, aquatic biologist for the Fish Commission of Oregon, is examining stomach contents to discover the lancet's eating habits, hopefully to determine why they come so close to shore during this time of year. Dr. Robert Olson, from Oregon State University's Department of Ecology, is studying the unique parasites associated with this fish. Specimens of the Pacific Lancetfish may be turned in at the Fish Commission laboratory on Marine Science Drive in Newport, Ore.
