Curry Area Students Attend SOC Workshop

Students from three Curry County high schools are attending a two week Aerospace Education Workshop at Southern Oregon College continuing through August 25.

The students, from Brookings-Harbor High School, Gold Beach High School and Pacific High School, are able to take the college course tuition free through a program--now in its second year--coordinated by the Curry County Intermediate Education District.

The workshop, designed for teachers and college students, is being held from Monday through Friday this week and next on the Ashland campus.

Participants in the workshop will visit an Air Force base, tour a radar station, see smoke jumpers in action and take flights in small aircraft. They also are hearing speakers from NASA, the Air Force, the Aerospace Industry, the Federal Aeronautics Association and the Civil Air Patrol. Students also will fire model rockets and tour a NASA laboratory near San Francisco.

The high school students are staying in the SOC dormitories while attending the workshop, and they are also participating in a "How to Study" clinic, campus tours and in a number of recreational activities.

SAIF Returns Record Cash

The State Accident Insurance Fund (SAIF) has begun the distribution of a record \$18.5 million in dividends earned by Oregon employers on their workmen's compensation insurance premiums. In announcing this record dividend, Charles B. Gill, Jr., SAIF General Manager, stressed the significance of this achievement for both labor and management.

"Since workmen's compensation insurance rates are based on the projected costs of anticipated accidents," Gill said, "an employer who receives a dividend is one who has, in effect, beaten the system. He's the one who has instituted an active safety program to hold down accidents. Fewer accidents mean lower insurance costs, and the difference can be returned as a dividend. The final result is that more Oregonians have a safer place to work, and more Oregon employers have a lower net insurance cost."
