Chief’s note: We had a nice slow week for crime, and traffic which was a

good break.
Traffic slowed probably because of cost of fuel but I saw that fuel prices are going back down so that will have a definite impact on vehicle traffic through our community through the summer.
Thanks to Fire Chief Wilcox our department was able to attend combined training with both fire and ambulance personnel in several areas. One was for Hazmat which is a yearly mandatory class for first responders and one class on handling violent persons. It was great

to work together with fire and ambulance personnel and share information.
Ambulance handle violent persons different then police so the training allowed us to collaborate our different practices and policies and be able to come up with techniques that will able us to be on the same page when a violent person incident occurs allowing limited injury to both emergency personnel and the victim/suspect.
Thanks to a vote by the budget committee after some necessary cuts the police budget is intact and we can now

hire a replacement for Sergeant Halse who recently left the department. This will take some time so please bear with me. In order to provide 24/7 coverage I must have available an officer or two to responded anytime 168 hours a week.
With the loss of the 40 hour additional patrol time some responses might be a little slower but I will continue to insure our department provide fast and efficient coverage and we will handle all emergency and backup calls immediately to insure the public and other agency responders remain safe.

Ducks Unlimited to hold annual dinner
Curry County’s Ducks Unlimited is hosting it’s second annual Sportsman’s Dinner, Saturday, May 17 at the Elks Lodge in Brookings.
Ducks Unlimited (DU) is an international organization aimed at habitat conservation and wetlands preservation. It was established in 1937 during the drought crisis of the Dust Bowl.
Since that small beginning, Ducks Unlimited is now the world’s largest and most effective waterfowl and wetlands conservation organization. Membership includes the United States, Canada and Mexico with more than one million supporters and over 12 million acres conserved.
In Oregon, Ducks Unlimited has 10,082 total memberships with 2,104 in Greenwings and 604 in sponsor members. The total dollars raised in Oregon is \$664,281 with 88,464 acres conserved.
One conservation effort included restoring approximately 50 acres of tidally influenced forested wetland and 20 acres of bottomland along the Klatskanine River.
“Curry County has more than 1,700 members,” said Peter Peterson of Gold Beach.
“Presently, there are 54 chapters in Oregon with 10 new perspectives. We’re in District 9, which includes Florence, Bandon, Coquille and Brookings.” Peterson, an officer for Curry County’s DU Chapter, has been a member of the organization for 24 years and a sponsor for 12. Other local chapter officers include Mary Ann Bartholomew and Gil Davis of Gold Beach, and Susan Larson and Alex Leighton of Brookings.
“The Greenwings program is for our youngest members,” said Peterson. “We help young people learn about conservation of habitat, hunting, fishing, and the great outdoors. The youth of today are very important to conservation; they are our stewards for the future. Ducks Unlimited conserves, restores, and manages wetlands and associated habitats for North America’s waterfowl. That is our mission statement.
“There will be decoys, sculptures, framed and signed prints - including a Terry Redland print, Greenwing items, knives, jewelry, children’s items and guns – such as a12/20, over/under, Mossberg shotgun,” Peterson said. “and we can’t thank them enough for their support.”
