Chief's note: The Port Orford Police Department currently has six sworn Reserve Police Officers who volunteer their time to help protect our community. Reserve officers are not paid for their time, and generally assist certified police officers by riding with them in patrol units, driving solo or in a two man reserve unit.

They can assist officers to answer emergency calls for service, to render aid, to make arrests, to write traffic citations, to follow-up cases, and testify in court.
These reserve police officers wear the same uniform, wear the same badge, and have the same authority of a regular certified police officer while on duty only. Additionally a reserve officer must complete

hundreds of hours of specialized training, and half of our reserve officers have additionally completed a Law Enforcement Police Reserve Academy.
These same officers attend the same in service training as the certified police officers do and must maintain minimum yearly training standards to maintain their Police Reserve status. Additionally the Port

Orford Police Department holds all reserve police officers to the same standard of conduct as a certified police officer.
I would like to thank all our officers for all the hard work they do for our community.

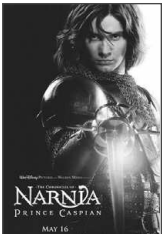
