

Port Orford Police report

Aug. 7
1.) Police took a harassment complaint involving two people on Jackson Street. Police took a report and the case is pending further incidents.
2.) Police arrested Ryan Beech on a Parole and Probation order. He was transported to the Curry County Jail and lodged on the offense.

Aug. 8
1.) Police responded to Tichenor St on a call of a domestic assault at that location. After an investigation, Phillip Russum was arrested for Domestic Assault and lodged in the Curry County jail. The case is pending review by the Curry County District Attorney.
2.) Police were notified about a possible child endangerment where the subjects had left the Port Orford area. After initial information was obtained, law Enforcement agencies in Douglas and Coos counties were located to watch for the subjects and vehicle and conduct a welfare check. No other action taken.

It was determined that the operator of a motorcycle had been driving for about 12 hours had drifted across several traffic lanes and struck the curb causing the motorcycle to roll. The driver refused medical transport. He was checked for injuries and no other action was taken.

Anelia La Verne Miller passed on peacefully in her sleep at the Elder Home of Port Orford, OR. She was born in Vermillion, SD, the youngest of seven girls. Anelia moved to California and earned an A.A. degree in Business from Visalia Junior College.

She married Nolan Clyde Miller in 1939 in Bakers-field, CA. They moved to Van Nuys, CA and had three children. Anelia was a cherished homemaker and gardener. She worked many years for the Los Angeles County Tax Assessor, which entailed door to door surveying of personal property. The family moved to Sunnyvale, CA in 1958, and she worked as a bookkeeper.

Anelia and Nolan enjoyed sports car racing and camping. They were members of the Sports Car Club of America, and worked as volunteers at various racetracks. She worked in track communications, and he was a turn marshal.
