## Police report

Police report for January 26, 2009

Jan. 7  
1.) Police received a report

that a subject had lost their wallet, believed to have been lost at a local business.

2.) Police responded to an alarm at a local bank. The bank was secure, apparent alarm malfunction.

3.) Police received a report of a burglary at a local motel. Report taken, incident under investigation. Anyone with information is asked to call your police department.

4.) Police received a report of another wallet lost at the 12th Street boat dock.

**Jan. 20**  
Police responded to an alarm at a local bank. This apparent alarm malfunction was reported to the alarm company. Second response this week to this location.

**Jan. 22**  
1.) Police received a report of a criminal mischief, damage to a vehicle. The vehicle was apparently struck with a heavy object, breaking a window and damaging the door. This incident remains under investigation.

2.) Police received a report of someone cutting wood on private property without permis-

sion. Patrols will be increased in the area. Incident is under investigation.

**Jan. 25**  
Port Orford Reserve Officer Derwin Boggs stopped a Chevrolet Suburban for speeding, 49 in a 30 zone.

This vehicle was from Michigan, and was occupied by four male occupants. Due to conditions observed, Officer Boggs called Port Orford Officer Randy Dresser, and Curry County Sheriff Sergeant Ted Longton to the scene to assist.

The driver, Robert Jarrett was arrested for Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants by Sergeant Longton. He was also cited for speeding.

Reserve officer Boggs arrested David Fox for unlawful possession of marijuana, a class B felony (over one ounce). He is being held in the Curry County Jail on \$100,000 bail.

Malvin Walden, the registered owner of vehicle, was cited for having an open container of alcohol and possession of less than an ounce of Marijuana, a violation.

The fourth subject was not

charged and was released at the scene.

The vehicle was secured and the registered owner was released on the citations. Traffic stops for speeding in Port Orford often lead to discovery of other violations and/or crimes. This is a good example of why it is important to slow people down in the City.

A Chevrolet Suburban is a large vehicle, and with an intoxicated driver at 3 o'clock in the afternoon on a Sunday, who knows who might be crossing the streets in Port Orford?

Thank you Sergeant Ted Longton of the Curry County Sheriff's Office for your quick response and assistance with the DUII arrest.

**Traffic enforcement activity:** Light this week. Seven traffic citations were issued for excessive speed. Nine warnings were also issued for speeding. Two citations issued for pedestrian/crosswalk violations, with one warning also issued. There were a total of 11 additional warnings for various equipment violations.

**Speeder of the week:** Sixty-five miles an hour in a

30 mile an hour zone. This driver also had no proof of insurance coverage!

All of the Police Officers and the Reserve Officers have completed their bi-annual (2X per year) qualification requirement for their service weapons. This is required by the State. Everyone qualified successfully.

Thank you to Forrest Simpson for his assistance in accomplishing this important task by acting as range master/instructor, and to Reserve Officer Derwin Boggs for arranging for the location. Other training for reserve officers has also been completed.

Each of the reserves received four hours of officer safety training, including laws, policies, force continuum, handcuffing and other related topics. In addition, each reserve officer received three and a half hours of basic traffic refresher training.

This includes traffic stops, proper positioning of officer and equipment, and interaction with the drivers.


All reserves participated and did very well.

30 percent chance of living two to five years. My response to the doctors and their percentages was that 100% of the people God calls home go home and 100% of the people God wants to stay around – stay around. But we don't stay one day longer or one day less than what God desires.

◆ I was slapped in the face by a diagnosis that changed all my expectations of what the future held for me. I came to quickly realize that my cancer was no surprise to God. The fact that I had never smoked and hadn't, to my knowledge, been exposed to cancer causing environments didn't change the fact that God had allowed this cancer into my life. The cancer had probably been growing for a year or more. All of a sudden I moved from a pleasant walk with my Savior by the still waters and green pastures of life

into the valley of the shadow of death. None of us want to be in this valley but when He leads us there it is for our good and for His glory. There are things to learn in the valley that can be learned in no other place.

◆ My life is in His hands. It always has been but sometimes we have the illusion that we are in control. Trusting God with my life on this earth should be no more difficult than trusting Him with my eternal salvation.

◆ God loves me and my family. Hard times don't separate us from God. It is in those times that we realize how far His love will go to reach us in our need.

◆ Every day has purpose. It seems that God may be putting a few more drops in the cup of my life. What I pour those drops onto is an expression of my thankfulness and worship. I have an obligation that I make the best use of every moment –

every opportunity.

◆ Life in Hi-definition is what God has called us to. So many things distract us – clutter our vision. The valley helps us to see the things that have eternal value and to live every moment God gives in ways that have eternal significance.

Do I know what the future holds? Yes and no. I know that I will remain on this earth as long as God finds it useful for His purpose. Even though my response to chemo and radiation has been good and the first follow-up CAT scan was very hopeful, my earth days have always been in His mind. So I move forward in confidence (the ministry of Canyonview moves ahead in confidence that our vision is from God) knowing that this uncertainty did not catch God unaware. I need to recognize my limits at the same time I recognize that God has

no limits. I can trust Him with my future, the future of my family, and the future of this ministry.

I am sure that some of you have been shaken by the losses on Wall Street or perhaps the loss of a home or a job. God was not caught unaware. He has allowed these things, these uncertain times, into our lives so that we would learn to trust the things that cannot be shaken. Instead of shaking a fist at heaven and demanding a "Why!" from God I encourage you to open your arms to heaven and ask "why"? Then seek to discern God's purpose. The hard times that God allows are so that we might share His holiness. They teach us and prove our character. The crucible of uncertain times is the place where the Master does some of His most amazing work.
