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N. Curry After School program ends for year

The North Curry After School Program ended its school year program and activities on May 27, providing a safe place for kids for two hours after school during the past school year.

Sixty-six kids participated in the program this year, which operated three to four afternoons each week. Those participating included students enrolled at schools in the 2CJ School District, the Head Start Program and home school students.

This program is only successful due to the support of its many community partners. Very special thanks goes to the thirty community volunteers who dedicated their time and talents to operate the program each week supervising activities, preparing snacks and planning programs. Susan Stevens and Brenda Fanning Foster are to be recognized for their extra effort in coordinating the program.

Special events for the kids this year included visits from the Paula Cracas, the worm lady, arts and crafts with Rosie Hajek and Darren Evans and special food treats from Betty Sejlund. Rebecca Brizzee, The People Place Parent Educator and Bronwyn Greathead, Curry County Prevention Specialist, hosted a girls' group during this

past spring quarter. All these special events resulted in lots of happy kids.

North Curry Families' and Children's Center, The People Place is the nonprofit administrator of the program. The Port Orford Christian Center hosts the program and contributes the use of their gymnasium. Port Orford-Langlois School District staff are partners in supporting

the program. The Curry County Commission on Children and Families awarded a small administration grant to The People Place for this past year.

The North Curry After School Program has received generous financial support from local individuals and organizations who donated \$ 1,540 during the past year.

In late May, The People Place received notification from Roger Meader, General Manager / CEO of Coos-Curry Electric Cooperative, Inc. that their Board of Directors had reviewed and approved a \$400.00 cash contribution to support the After School Program.

"This generous donation will be used to support the start-up of the program for the next school year" according to Ollie Jones, Director at The People

Place.

Planning is already underway for next year's program that will start in September. The consolidation of schools at Driftwood will increase the number of kids attending the program.
