Police report

June 1
1.) Police responded to a dispute at a local business. The matter was peacefully resolved.
2.) A person reported an argument to 911 for fear of escalation. Officers responded and assisted in preventing any further problems.
3.) Officers were recalled to a local business in regards to a possible trespass. The individual who was believed to have been on the property was found at another location while officers were responding to the business.
4.) Police took a hit and run report. The vehicle that had been struck suffered minor damage. Officers would like to remind everyone that in the event that you accidentally hit another vehicle it is best to notify them and deal with the problem. If not you could face hefty fines, possible license suspension, criminal charges, and jail time.

June 3
1.) Police took a criminal mischief report on damage done to a vehicle.
2.) A shoplifter was reported at a local business. The individuals were stopped and checked though no property was found in their possession. Further investigation is being conducted.

June 4
1.) Police took a report of criminal mischief. The perpetrators childishly broke a door to an outside tool shed. Upon leaving they also turned the outside water tap on. The water ran for about 2 weeks until a neighbor found it. The home owners were away on vacation when this occurred.
2.) More stop signs within the city were found pulled up and destroyed.

June 5
1.) A person was arrested on a Curry County warrant for animal cruelty and animal neglect.
2.) Police were requested by a local business in regards to a large amount of damage done. The damage was documented and the case is on its way to the DA. Upon review the person who committed the act will be arrested and prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law. The person is known.

June 8
A black and green mongoose bicycle was found and is now in police custody.

June 9
1.) Local police assisted the Curry County Sheriff's Office

by taking an initial report on an assault that had occurred in the county area.
2.) A found dog is currently being cared for by a concerned resident. If you would like to inquire about the animal contact police for further details.
3.) Police were requested to perform a welfare check on a local resident by a concerned family member from out of state. Everything checked out okay.

June 10
1.) Child Protective Services (a State agency) requested that an officer be present at an initial interview concerning domestic violence and its impact on children. Services were provided as requested.
2.) A complaint was filed in regards to a noise ordinance. The person was contacted and the problem was resolved.

June 11
1.) A boat trailer was damaged at some time during the night of 6/10. The evidence was documented and is currently under investigation.
2.) Buffington Park reported a person walking their dog without a leash. The person was contacted and warned that if they did so again they would receive a citation. Dogs must be on a leash at all times within the City.

Traffic activity picked up significantly.
Many people are not obeying the speed limits. The new flashing lights on the north end of town have helped somewhat, but significant violations are still occurring.
Officers wrote nearly 100 citations for excessive speed, along with nearly 80 warnings for speed. Officers also made detained two subjects for outstanding warrants, and transported these subject to the Curry County Jail for lodging. Two persons were cited in two separate incidents for Possession of a Controlled Substance, less than an ounce of marijuana.

Speed of the week 77 miles an hour in a 30 mile zone. Person stated that they didn't see the town, even though they traveled almost the entire length of the City.

Please drive carefully and remember that there will be increased traffic, and that children are out and about. **School is now out for the summer, so please be watchful.**
