HAZMAT collection a big success
A very successful Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event was held on Saturday, June 20 from 9 am to 2 pm.
One hgundred nd ninty-four "customers" were served during this event, and a significant amount of hazardous materials were collected.
Approximately 40 mercury thermometers were also collected. While exact numbers will be forthcoming, it appears that nearly an entire semi-trailer load was collected. This collection event ensures that these materials will be disposed of properly.
All of the materials that were collected in this event is material that will not end up in our landfills, and potentially into

The event was well received by those who participated. DEQ estimated that we would serve 140-170 during this event, we actually served 194.

Alan met his wife Miekko in Tokyo, Japan. They have two children, a son Michael, born in Okinawa and a daughter, Emi, born in Honolulu.
Upon retiring from the Navy Alan and his family settled in Beaverton, Oregon where he spent 6 years working at Vetch Phones. Alan now works for Hitachi Medical Systems installing and maintaining MRI scanners and Ultra sound.
Alan's hobbies are building wooden and plastic models, sailing radio controlled model yachts, reading and cooking.
Jack served six years in the Navy during Vietnam. For two years he served on a destroyer escort as a Sonar Technician and member of the Nuclear Weapons Handling Team. He finished his naval service aboard a nuclear powered submarine as a Sonar Technician and Ships Swimmer.
After the Navy, Jack has had a distinguished career in advanced electronics with the government and private industry. Over the years his career has taken him from San Francisco to Boston and down south to Atlanta. He and his wife Kathryn came back to Oregon and opened a bakery and café in Florence for six years. Jack took a year off for health reasons and then jumped back into the water when he became the General Manager of a 100 seat restaurant. Not very

long after he had this project up and running he received a call from the Coquille Indian Tribe offering him the position of Tribal Planner. This was a dream come true for Jack as he saw it as an opportunity to give back to the Tribe. Jack currently serves on the Coquille Tribe's Finance Committee. He is Chairman of the Tribal culture Committee and a member of the Fish and Wildlife Committee. He is a sitting member of the Economic development Corporation Board of directors. He also serves in the ONABEN (A Native American Business Network) as well as the Coos County Area transit Advisory Board. He is Vice President of the Board of Directors for the West Lane translators and Siuslaw Library District Grant Committee.
After graduating, Michael enlisted in the Navy and served as Fire Control Technician on board the USS Biddle and the USS Leahy. Michael served for 6 years. He went to work in the medical field doing installations and repair on MRI and other medical equipment. In 1985 he moved to Anchorage, Alaska where he installed the first MRI in Alaska. He serviced the equipment for 4 years. He was with Health Images in Atlanta, Ga. for 9 years managing production, logistics and repair.
