The Port Orford Volunteer Fire Department was dispatched to a structure fire on Friday, June 26th.  
The Fire Department responded with two pumpers, one ten-

der and a rescue vehicle. We requested Port Orford Community Ambulance be dispatched for standby.  
The fire was a chimney fire. Firefighters entered the home,

extinguished the fire in the wood-burning stove and gained access to the attic. We laddered the roof and used a hose line to apply a minimal amount of water to cool the creosote fire in

the chimney.  
Firefighters were on scene for approximately two hours. We continued to check the scene throughout the afternoon and evening.
