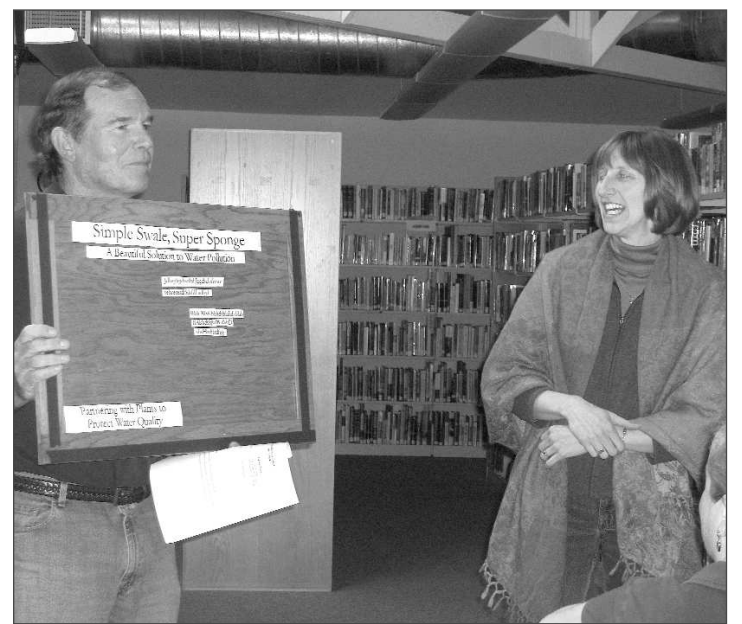

Bioswales to be built in Gold Beach, Port Orford, Langlois

Bioswales (or rain gardens) are shallow, planted drainage courses designed to filter pollutants from the landscape before runoff can enter the storm sewer or watershed. The most common use of bioswales is where substantial auto contaminants are collected on the paved area and then ultimately flushed by the rain. Examples of these are around parking lots and apartment complexes, and at business parks and shopping centers.

During their training in the fall of 2008, the north Curry County Ford Family Foundation Leadership Group (AKA North Curry Assets) decided to build a demonstration bioswale in each of the three communities they represent. In Gold Beach it will be at the Visitor Center; in Port Orford at Battle Rock Wayside (near the Visitor Center); and in Langlois at the Langlois Public Library. These three sites were chosen because the demonstration bioswales will address existing needs and the locations

provide high visibility for public involvement and education.

During the last six months, the Leadership group has been raising funds, educating the public, partnering with city and library administrators, designing the bioswales, researching and ordering plants, and planning the interpretive signs. Now we're ready to begin digging and planting and we'd like to have your help!

Because it is the smallest and easiest one to build, the Langlois bioswale will happen first. Site preparation will be done at the Langlois Library on Saturday, August 8, beginning at 10:00AM. At this time, local advocate and Wilderland School director George Fleming will excavate the site and volunteers will rake the ground and flag plant locations. The following Saturday, August 15, volunteers will gather again to set native plants into the ground. So bring your favorite gloves and tools and come join us. After the planting is done, volunteers are invited to a celebration barbeque at the library.

Site preparation at the Gold Beach Visitor Center will begin after Labor Day in September, and the Port Orford project will begin after the City of Port Orford completes some initial ground preparation.
