Potatoes as a Cow Feed.
Potatoes are not considered a very good cow feed. If fed they should be sliced and only a small portion fed daily. Twenty pounds are about enough to use. The Vermont station reports that the heavy feeding of potatoes caused a very poor quality of butter.

Carrots For Dairy Cattle.
Carrots make a very good, succulent feed for cows. They are relished and can be fed in amounts up to forty or fifty pounds daily, depending upon the size of the cow. They do not contain as much total digestible nutrients, however, as do sugar beets, but are on a par with rutabagas and contain slightly more than mangels.

Silage is a good thing for dairy cows, for fattening steers, for feeding ewes and fattening lambs.

Put new floors in the pens when it is necessary. It is dangerous to have holes in the flooring of the pigpens.

Give each colt its regular grain ration and enough clean, bright hay to keep it growing and thrifty.

Flockmasters should carefully guard against exposing flocks to drafts. When they lie in drafts catarrh is liable to be the result.

If the pigs are cold and pinched they can make no gain. Look out for them, protect them, or you will be the loser in dollars. Keep the colts fat, and you will have an easy keeping, hardy horse.

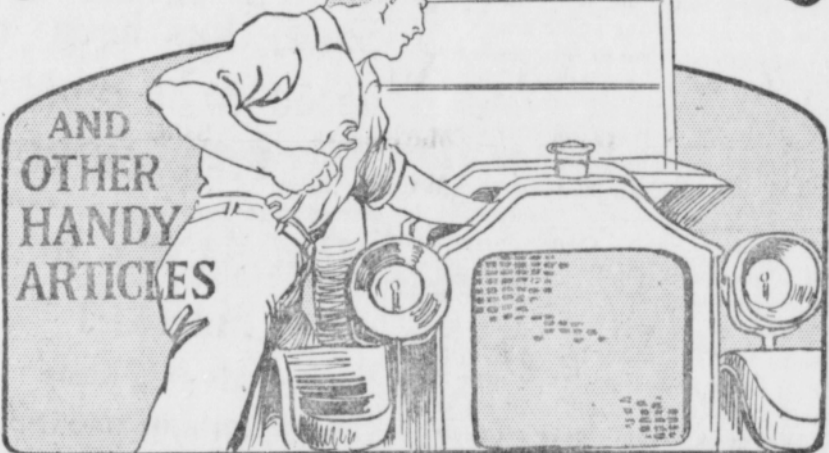
