WILLIAM HAMMOND IS ELECTED PRESIDENT OF BAR ASSOCIATION

William Hammond, of Hammond & Hammond, Saturday night was elected President of the Clackamas County Bar Association. Other officers are Joseph J. Hedges, vice president; Walter A. Hedges, secretary, and John N. Sievers, treasurer.

The Clackamas County Bar association has been inactive for several years and the meeting Saturday night, which was held in the county court room in the court house, was the second in eight years. Gorpon E. Hays is the retiring president.

The association will probably hold quarterly meetings. In the near future a supper will be given. O. D. Eby, Thomas A. Burke and Bernard N. Hicks were appointed a committee to arrange for this event. A permanent program committee consists of J. E. Hedges, Chris Schubel and John Sievers.

A number of talks were made Saturday night. Judge Hays outlined the field of such an organization, and said that he hoped to see the association active in the future. C. Schubel, H. E. Cross and Walter A. Dimick each made short talks.—Morning Enterprise.

Articles of incorporation of the Bank of Commerce of Oregon City have been approved and filed by S. G. Sargent, state superintendent of banks. The new bank will have a paid up capital of \$50,000 and a surplus of \$5000. Superintendent Sargent announced that the bank would be open for business on or before December 1.

The incorporators are LeRoy D. Walker, Will T. Wright, J. E. Hedges, D. F. Skene and L. A. Brandes. Mr. Walker was formerly president and manager of the Canby State Bank. He will probably be cashier and manager of the new institution. Mr. Wright is ex-state superintendent of banks and is now vice-president of the Scandinavian-American bank of Portland.

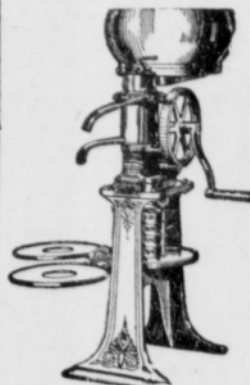

ORDINANCE

An ordinance for the purpose of levying a tax of five mills on all taxable property, both real and personal within the City of Sandy.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SANDY:

Section 1; That the Common Council of the City of Sandy does hereby levy a tax of five (5) mills on all the taxable property, real and personal, which is taxable for state and county purposes, within the corporate limits of the City of Sandy, to be collected as other taxes are collected in the State of Oregon, by the Treasurer and Tax Collector of Clackamas County, Oregon, during the year 1915, with the taxes commonly known as the taxes of 1914.

Read for the first time and ordered posted at a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Sandy, held on the 18th day of October, A. D., 1915, and to come up for final passage at a regular meeting of the said council to be held on the 1st day of November, 1915, at 7:30 o'clock, p. m., at the City Hall.

NOTICE OF ROAD BUDGET MEETING

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to Chapter 234 of the General Laws of Oregon, 1913, and Chapter 225 of the General Laws of Oregon, 1915, a meeting of the legal voters residing in the City of Sandy, being the legal voters of the road district which is constituted by the City of Sandy, Clackamas County, Oregon, will be held at the City Hall in the City of Sandy, or District of Sandy on the 11th day of November, A. D., 1915, at the hour of 7:30 o'clock p. m., for the purpose of considering the following estimate of the amount of money to be raised by a special tax in said City of Sandy or road district within the City of Sandy, for the ensuing year.

For the improvement and maintenance of Revenue County Road: \$850.00.

Probable receipts of said road district from sources other than from direct tax upon real and personal property for the ensuing year, unknown.

Amount of balance on hand in road fund to be spent on roads within the limits of the City of Sandy, none.

There will also be a certain amount of money for use on the roads and streets of the City of Sandy from the annual road tax levied by tax payers of the County of Clackamas. This tax has not been levied, but during the year 1915, if all of the taxes within the City of Sandy had been paid by the end of the year, will have yielded about \$293.00.
