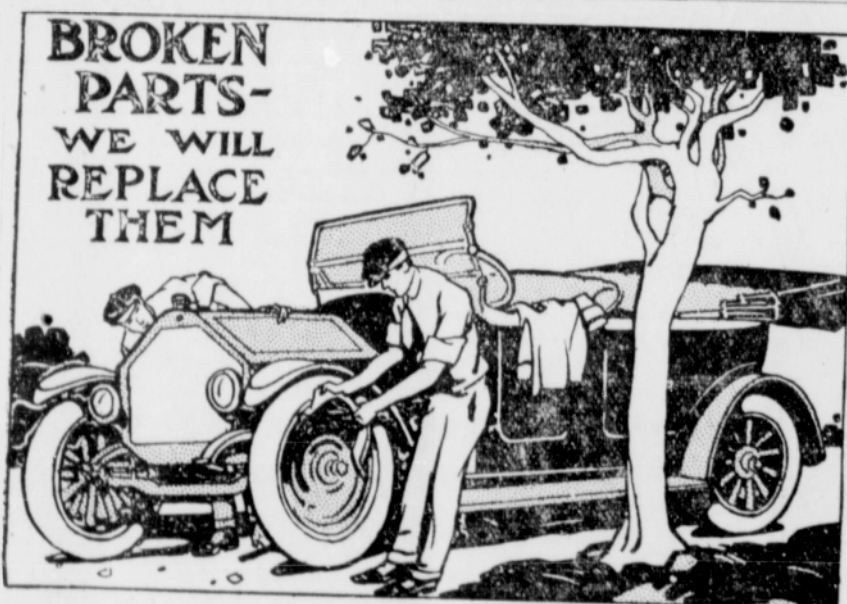

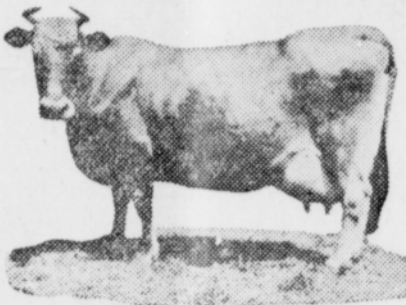

DEVELOPING A BULL.

Young Males Should Not Run With the Herd—Good Grain Ration.
[By F. C. Minkler, New Jersey experiment station.]

Experience prompts that it is the best judgment to grow a bull calf intended for breeding purposes well during the first fifteen months and not to expose him to service until he is fourteen or fifteen months old. Often when young bulls are mated during their early stages of growth and development their vigor is impaired, they are more restless in and around the barn and their growth is more or less retarded. It is exceedingly wasteful of his energy to permit him to run with a herd of cows and mate with such animals

as come into use repeatedly. Very often it is found that when young bulls are used extensively for service under a year old they do not prove to be responsible breeders at maturity. It would seem wise therefore to wait until the bull is fourteen or fifteen months old before mating him with any cows; feed a liberal grain ration, but do not fatten during this growing period; that he have facilities for exercising and thus avoid the development of a barrel out of proportion to the rest of his body.

The amount of roughage fed him in the way of hay and coarse feed should be limited to a reasonable quantity. A very useful grain mixture for a bull of the age suggested would be made up as follows: Two parts of crushed oats, two parts of wheat bran, two parts of distillery grains, one part of oilmeal. This should be fed in a quantity approaching five to eight pounds per day and supplemented with alfalfa, clover hay or green forage, including pasture if it is available. Enough of the grain mixture should be fed to keep the bull's coat in a fine silky condition and his skin loose and pliable, but there should be no evidence of excessive flesh about the back, the loins or hind-quarters. It would be appropriate to dishorn the bull when he is twelve months of age, and at the same time a ring should be put into his nose in order that he may realize at this time that he is not monarch of all he surveys. He should be educated to obey the commands of the herdsman, and such schooling is most appropriately conveyed when the youngster is under six months of age.

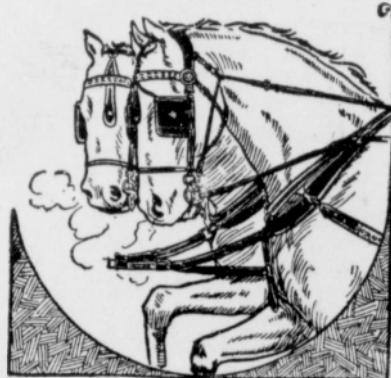
