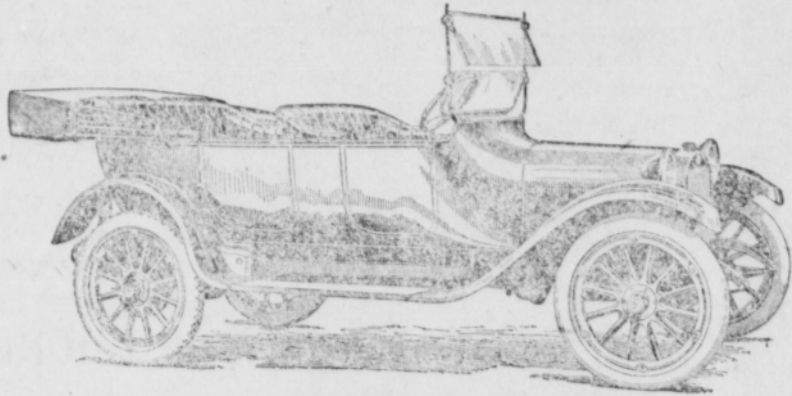

Both French and German are the "official" languages of Switzerland. Public signs, such as those of rail roads, are printed in both languages. Italian is also spoken in those parts of Switzerland which are closest to Italy. As a matter of fact, the country is, however, quite definitely divided as to language. The cantons of Vaud, Neuchatel, Geneva, Fribourg and most of Valais speak French. The canton of Ticino speaks Italian. The rest of the country speaks preponderantly German. The canton of Valais has different districts, where each of the three languages is spoken.

IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OF OREGON: You are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint filed against you and each of you in the above entitled action, on or before the 3rd day of July, A. D., 1916, and if you fail to answer or appear for want thereof, plaintiff will apply to the court for the relief demanded in the complaint, to-wit:

For a judgement in the sum of \$750.00 with interest at the rate of 8 per cent per annum from October 10, 1914, until paid; for the further sum of \$75.00 attorney's fees and for his costs and disbursements herein, and that execution issue therefore.
