We have made arrangements with a nearby print shop for the necessary linotyping of news, but the deadline must be Monday noon. Any item reaching this office after that hour will mean the unfortunate holding over until the next issue.

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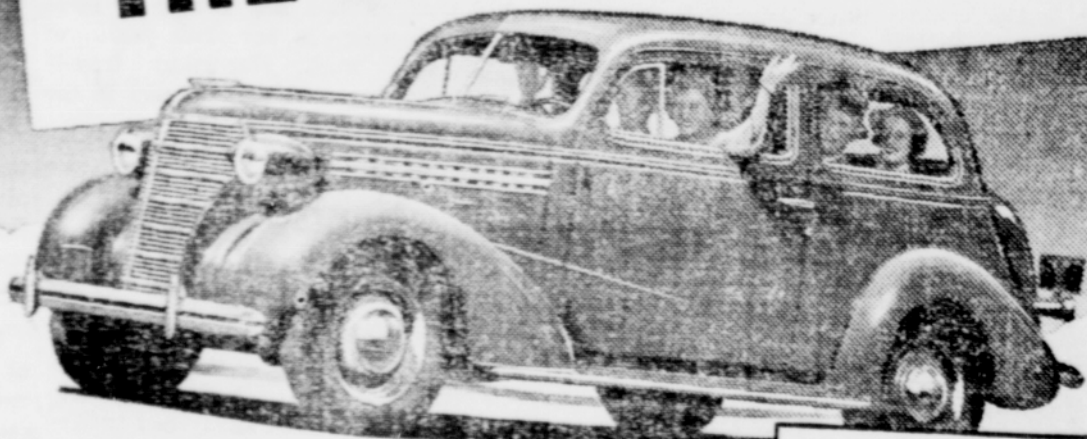


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
