Dodge Park History Told

"Dodge Park was acquired by the city of Portland in 1888, with a 18,000-acre purchase of water rights in the Bull Run district. The first water line was laid in 1895 when the pipe was hauled from Portland by oxen; horses were used for the second water line in 1910, and trucks for the third and last line in 1921. Dodge

PGE Co. Improves Hood Loop Service

The Portland General Electric Co. has had construction crews continuously on the old loop Electric Co. lines since they took them over last March. They announce the plan to run a "third leg" from the power plant to Rhododendron which will increase the capacity of the line and improve the voltage. This work will start immediately and require a month's time and will cost in the neighborhood of two thousand dollars.

In addition to an extensive job of tree trimming, the crews have completed stubbing and replacing old poles over the entire route of the line and run several lateral lines to serve families who have never had electricity before.
