MACHINERY AND LABOR

M. V. Thomas, Damascus Grange, Clackamas County.

Editor Bulletin: Some time since I wrote a reply to how to put the young to work.

Technicians, after making a survey, find that machinery is running about half time. As an example, take auto machinery. If run at capacity nine motor cars would be produced every year for each person. Shoe machinery could produce eleven pairs of shoes for every person and textile mills 36 yards of cloth, with millions in range and naked.

Thirty years ago man power in making an auto required 1291 hours, today it is 62 hours, and this is about the average in every

industry. Who is going to consume these products?

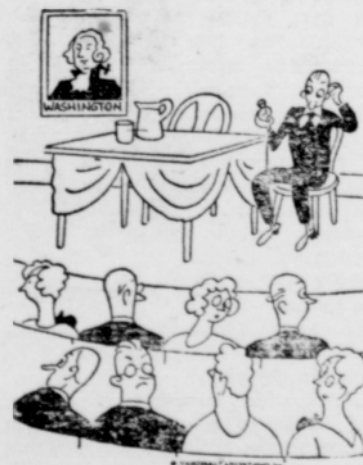
