## Hints on Canning Given by Agent

"Many homemakers are requesting information on methods of preserving strawberries", says Helen Ann Thomas, home demonstration agent. The method generally recommended is as follows:

Wash, and stem strawberries and place in a preserving kettle with alternate layers of sugar and berries using two-thirds cup of sugar to one quart of raw berries. Let the berries stand over night or at least 24 hours. Boil one minute pack in hot jars to one inch from the top and process 10 minutes in a hot water bath. This method helps to prevent shrinkage and produces an even distribution of berries in the jar.

In processing in the hot water bath, completely seal the jars and immerse them in boiling water so that the water flows one inch over the top of the jar.

### EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

"Thirty-seven Clackamas county homemakers representing 14 units and 9 study clubs met to plan the year's program for the home economics extension service", says Helen Ann Thomas, home demonstration agent. A stimulating program of work has been planned for the year which begins in the fall and continues through to May of the following year.

The extension unit meetings will consist of two meetings by the agent on weight control, at which time basic principles of health in relation to food will be discussed (continued to page 8)
