CLACKAMAS COUNTY FAIR IN SEPTEMBER

The Clackamas county fair front was bustling over the week end with indications pouring in to the fair board pointing to the largest fair in the county's history.

Edwin Keltner, county club agent, announced an increase in 4H club demonstrations from six events last year to 13 this year. He also pointed out changes affecting this nation-wide organization in the coming fair. Classes in ewe and fat lambs, hampshire, gilt and fat hogs have been added; rabbit exhibits are altered so that club members can enter four singles, junior and senior does and bucks. Ribbons are to be awarded every exhibitor; seven special awards are to be presented by firms interested in agriculture activities. All top exhibitions will be entered at the state fair, Keltner also announced.

Harold Bernier, floral department superintendent, announced the addition of a cut flower class for all garden clubs and an increase in all floral premiums.

Herman Chindgren, president of the fair board, stated that farm implement displays should

be greatly increased over past fairs since more entries have been received by the board than at any other like period in the fair's 34 years.

A song festival is to be incorporated in this year's show and is open to all granges or community clubs. It is open for solos, small ensembles and choruses. Prizes are over \$30. Mrs. M. B. Nichols, Jr., chairman announced.

Several entries have been received in the harness racing program slated for each of the four days, August 28 to 31, John Telford, board secretary, stated. He also added that Clyde Dick, groundkeeper at Canby, was working on the fairgrounds so that they will be prepared within a few weeks.

June Wilcox, Sandy candidate in the popularity contest was still holding third place in the race standings over the weekend. The blonde Sandy maid is sponsored by the local chamber of commerce.
