FOOD STAMP PLAN CONTINUED

Assuring truck farmers of a market for their produce in the Multnomah, Marion and Clackamas County areas are new and continued designations of seasonal surplus vegetables, which, together with nationally designated surplus foods, will be available under the Food Stamp Plan, for the period August 12 through September 1.

Snap beans, beets, carrots, corn, tomatoes, celery and lettuce are the fresh vegetables which have been added to or continued on the local list of surplus foods which families taking part in the Food Stamp Plan may obtain during the August 12 to September period for blue food stamps at local stores, according to Hunter L. Scott, local representative of the Food Stamp Program.
