CLACKAMAS COUNTY FAIR OPENS AUGUST 28

Weeks of diligent preparation have made ready Clackamas county's largest fair in the 33 year's past history—more features, more entries, more enthusiasm and more classes will mark this year's harvest festival which opens August 28, at the Canby fair grounds. Four days and nights will be cramed with a host of activities that tag this local enterprise one of the finest in the state, Herman Chindgren, presi-

dent of the fair board, confirmed this week.

Although space for the avalanche of entries will be precious during the approaching fair, ground improvements and detailed planning that considered the increase in participants insure the best-organized and most completely filled program since the fair came to Canby in 1906.

Governor day will highlight the opening day ceremonies, when in the evening Governor Charles Sprague will crown Miss Clackamas County. The popularity contest will close this Saturday at

midnight, after which time season admission buttons will jump to 35 cents and remain at that price through the festival.

The loaded program includes educational, industrial and agricultural exhibits, demonstrations musical hours, 4H and FFA work judging, crop and stock displays, dancing nightly to Johnny Lee's popular band, vaudeville acts each afternoon by the highly talented Eddie Burke troupe of California, parades, carnival, implement shows, fireworks, night shows, and the always popular harness racing program each afternoon. Many novelty contests have been arranged for this year; topping the long list of features are the hog and husband calling contests and the farmerette competition.

GROUSE

Grouse hunters will have their innings when the season for Scotty or Blue grouse opens in three eastern Oregon counties—Walla, Union and Baker—next week.

The season opens Sunday, August 25, and closes on August 31. The bag limit is four birds in any one day but not more than eight in any seven consecutive days.

There are many sportsmen from all parts of the state who enjoy grouse shooting and it is expected that the brief season will attract many hunters.
