For those who are not familiar with the set up of the State Em-

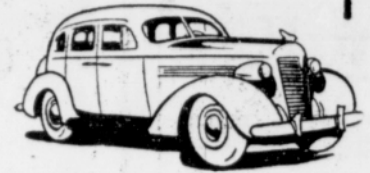
ployment Service, it might be well to inform them that this service is free to both employer and employe.
