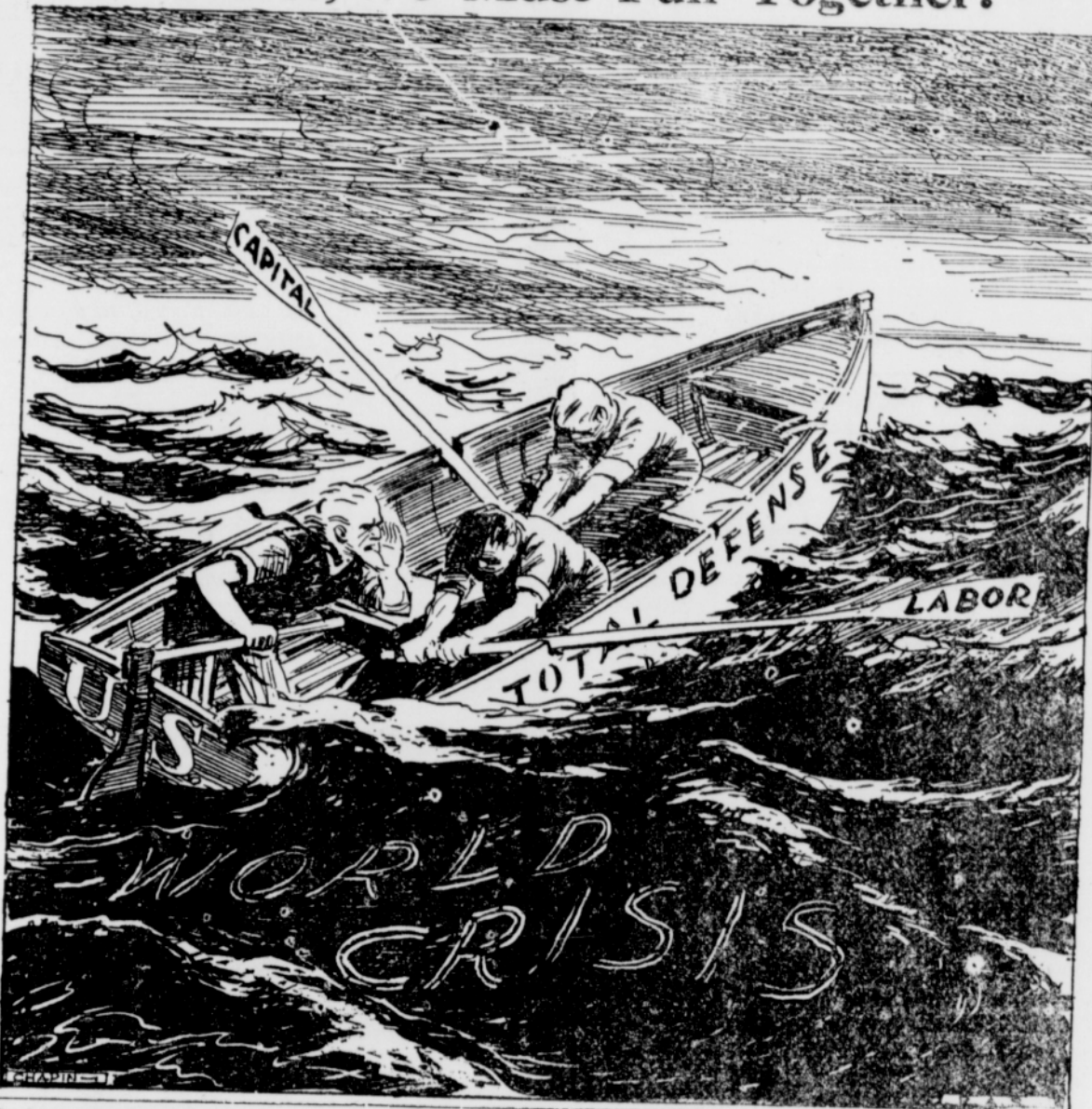
Programs for the seventh annual Willamette valley 4-H club leaders' conference at Oregon State college, Corvallis, have just been received by Edwin Keltner, 4-H club agent. The conference is January 20, 21, and 22, and a group of Clackamas county local leaders will attend.

Last year fourteen from this county participated in the three days of instruction on 4-H club leadership. Registration will begin at 11 in the morning, January 20, allowing all leaders to go to Corvallis on Monday. The conference will close Wednesday at 1:30 in the afternoon, giving all leaders an opportunity to return home that evening.
