At the meeting they also planned a dance to be given in the High School auditorium on Friday evening, May 1. Each member will be allowed two invitations and music will be furnished by Hancock's orchestra.

The Sandy High school band, under the supervision of Mr. C. C. Bates, was given one of the four first division ratings in the District Conference held at Newberg on April 19.

Sandy's band competed against 16 other bands.

The band is now planning a drive to raise funds enough to go to the Northwest Regional Music Contest, to be held at Tacoma, Washington, on May 16 and 17.

The board of directors of Sandy have said that the school will take care of the transportation and also donate \$50 toward the band going, if the band is able to raise enough otherwise.

Those who placed second from Sandy were: King in pole vault; Orr in the high jump; Mullen in the mile; Hodell, throwing discus; Dyer, throwing javelin; and Orr, in the 440 yard run.
