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MOLALLA IS SET
FOR BIG BUCKEROO

MOLALLA—This western town is a beehive of activity as the time approaches for the 18th annual Buckeroo to be held at Molalla on July 4, 5, and 6. This year's roundup promises to be the best ever staged as prize money totaling \$2650 will attract nationally known cowboys, including Clay Carr, world's champion calf roper, and topnotch cowhands of the northwest, according to Fred Henriksen, Buckeroo association president.

Stock has been shipped here by Clarence Warren of Condon. He has wild horses, longhorn steers, Brahama steers and speedy calves. The steers came from New Mexico ranges. Scheduled rodeo events each day are bronc riding, bulldogging, calf roping, bull riding, bareback riding, wild cow milking contest, relay cowboy and cowgirl races, besides Roman racing, trick roping and riding by Frank and Bernice

Dean.

One of the features of this year's show at Molalla will be participation in western drill competition at the Buckeroo.

First mass drill contest to be sponsored for the Buckeroo in its 21 years, the event is believed to be the wildest ever held in Oregon for riding aggregations. The posses will vie in the arena during the show Sunday, July 6, Henriksen stated.

CUT OF 415,000 FACED
BY WPA FORCES JULY 1

WASHINGTON, June 24—WPA Commissioner Howard Hunter announced Tuesday that more than 415,000 persons will be dropped from WPA rolls on July 1, cutting the employment authorization to 1,000,000 for the nation, the lowest in WPA history.

Hunter told a press conference that 1500 counties will be dropped from WPA rolls and estimated that the number receiving work relief will be under 1,000,000.

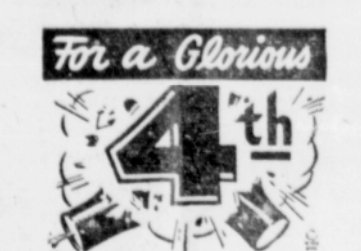

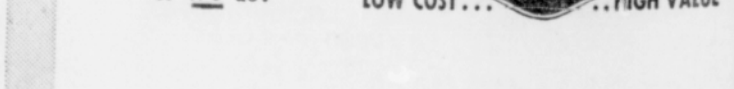
