TURN THOUGHTS TO "OLD GLORY"

As a part of the campaign of education in national loyalty, now being promoted throughout the nation, the attention of the American people is being directed to their national emblem, the "Stars and Stripes," the world's outstanding symbol of freedom and personal liberty.

Patriotic organizations throughout our country, realizing that a widespread knowledge of the flag's history and significance is a powerful impetus for building loyalty and devotion to our nation, are encouraging respect and love for the flag in the schools and among adult citizens, and are disseminating information about "Old Glory."

The U. S. Navy, through its recruiting service offices, is giving wide distribution to a folder, "The Flag of the United States, How to Display and Respect It." Flag manufacturers report an unprecedented demand for flags, large and small. Business concerns are

devising plans for distribution of the flag and information concerning it.

As an example of this latter activity, in our own section of the country, the management of the Longview Bridge, which spans the Columbia River between Longview, Washington, and Rainier, Oregon, has purchased 15,000 flags—one of the largest orders ever placed in the Pacific Northwest—and is placing one on every car crossing the bridge during the month of July. Over the roadway, at the ends of the bridge, they have suspended two of the largest flags ever flown in this section. On a statement given out with each flag, the following stirring couplet is featured:

"Our Flag—may it wave forever!
Our Faith—may it waver never!"

As a means of awakening renewed interest in the flag, it is suggested that the following little-known fact should be brought to the attention of the citizens of

every state: Do you know that one specific star among the 48 on the flag, represents YOUR state? And do you know which particular star it is?

We all have long known that the 48 stars represent the 48 states, but that each stands for a specific state comes as a surprise to most citizens. The historic fact is that President Taft issued an executive order in 1912, which fixed the arrangement of the stars in six rows of eight stars each, and stated that the stars should symbolize the states in the order of their admission to the Union.

Accordingly, as Oregon was the thirty-third state to be admitted, it is represented by the first star in the fifth, or next to the last, row; and Washington, forty-second in order of admission, has its particular star, the second from the left in the bottom row.

It is well for us all to remember the symbolic meanings of the flag's colors, which are officially set forth as follows: "White signifies purity, innocence; red, hardness and valor. Blue is the traditional color of the American uniform, and this color signifies vigilance, perseverance, and justice."

So, as we look at "Old Glory" rippling in the breeze, let us remember what its colors stand for, and let us pick out the particular star in this mighty constellation which represents our own state, and be thankful that it "is still there."

STATE GRADE A MILK GOOD FOR ARMY BIDS

Dairymen who have been granted the right to use the state Grade A label on their milk will have no difficulty in meeting the requirements of the quartermaster department for sale to the army, says A. W. Metzger, chief of the foods and dairies division of the state department of agriculture. Regulations for those selling milk to the army and to CCC camps are not more rigid than those for meeting the Grade A requirements.

Bids call, in most cases, for Grade A pasteurized milk. The army purchasing officer has informed the department that the army will take state inspection, as it has been doing in the past.

Dairymen under the state Grade A regulation have nothing to fear when they submit bids in the defense milk purchases, for these regulations are in many respects more strict than the standard ordinance of the U. S. public health service. The U. S. public health milk ordinance is a minimum requirement covering the various states.
