HIGHLIGHTS OF HOMEMAKER'S CAMP

Women of the Willamette Valley can have an unusual and interesting vacation this summer for a minimum cost by attending a home-maker's vacation camp. Two camps will be held at the Smith Creek camp site in the Silver Creek Recreation Area. The first camp will open with an evening meal July 23 and closes after dinner Sunday. The second camp is held one week later. It also opens with an evening meal Wednesday and closes after dinner Sunday. Campers wear house dresses or slacks. Each camper brings her own bed roll and dishes which includes a plate, saucer, cup, knife, fork and spoon. Beds are provided at the camp for 45 campers. However, there is no objection to a camper bringing her own if she wants to sleep in the open.

The camp site is built on the new plan of unit cabins with two or four campers in a cabin. It is divided in two sections—one on the hill for the early risers and one in the valley for those who wish to sleep until later.

A rising bell is sounded at 7:30 to call campers to an 8:00 o'clock breakfast.

The food is delicious. Home Demonstration Agent Hazel Packer from Yamhill county, will be the dietitian and an assistant director the first week. Miss Ann Epperson, home demonstration agent from Multnomah county, will take her place at the second camp.

The camp program will include discussion on various topics—crafts, sketching, nature lure, book chats, and a daily vespere service and campfire program. Some of the crafts which will be included in the program are metal etching, basketry and patriotic lapel ornaments.

A library is provided for those who wish to read. Nature trails are inviting to those who wish to hike.

Miss Izola Jensen will direct each of the camps. Those interested in attending camp should enroll as early as possible, as the camp will accommodate only 45 campers. Enrollment cards can be secured by writing M. Irene Leach home demonstration agent, Post Office building, Oregon City.

DOG QUARANTINE JULY 9 TO AUGUST 8

The rabies have again hit this district with the dog of Lewis Hauglun being first to contract the disease. It is believed that the dog developed rabies from fighting with skunks.

Tuesday, July 1st, the dog bit Mrs. Hauglun and their granddaughter Sheila Chase. They are being given the Pasteur treatment at the office of Dr. C. Don Platner.

One hundred one dogs were vaccinated last Saturday at the home of M. Radford, county dog catcher by the assistant state veterinarian and will again be vaccinated Friday, July 11.

An emergency quarantine on dogs will be in effect in parts of Clackamas county for 30 days from July 9 through August 8, the state department of agriculture announced today. Presence of rabies prompted the quarantine.

The restricted area is as follows: Bounded on the south and west by the main Mount Hood Loop highway back at the point where it crosses from Multnomah county into Clackamas county, proceeding along the Mount Hood highway until it intersects Sandy river near Messinger Bottom, then westerly and northerly along Sandy river until the boundary of the Multnomah-Clackamas county line is reached and then west until it crossed the main Mount Hood-Sandy river highway.

No dog may be moved from the quarantined area and all dogs must be held in restraint unless they have been vaccinated twice with anti-rabies vaccine within the past year. More than 14 days must have elapsed since the second vaccination.
