Big New Stage Built for Fair

Construction of a new and larger stage in front of the grandstand at the Oregon state fair grounds is now in progress, fair officials report. The stage will be 50 feet wide and 46 feet deep. Seed Samplers Get Instruction

Preliminary to taking official samples of all Austrian winter field pea and hairy vetch seed purchased in Oregon under the AAA program, 20 seed samplers

of the state department of agriculture gathered early this week for final instructions.

The group met Monday at the department headquarters in Salem, and the following day spent at the state laboratory in Corvallis.

Estimates now are that the pea seed inspections will drop considerably below last year, but that there will be a great increase in the hairy vetch seed produced under the program.

UNEMPLOYMENT PAYMENTS LESS

Salem, July 17—Unemployment benefits during June were less than for any month since first payments were made in January, 1938. Only \$143,256—less than half of the June, 1940, benefits, was paid last month, according to Administrator Silas Gaiser.

Payments to the unemployed for the first half of 1940 were \$1,756,042, nearly 38 per cent less than for the same period last year. The reserve fund on June 30 was \$12,037,402, an increase of

nearly 45 per cent over the \$8,295,045 on deposit a year previously.

With contributions on second quarter pay rolls, all of which will be at the 2.7 per cent rate, expected to run close to two million dollars, the 14,000,000 mark may be reached soon.

New experience rates received last week by 5,890 of Oregon's 10,000 covered employers, will be effective on third quarter pay rolls contributions on which are received in October. Still another set of experience rates will be figured for 1942 pay rolls with chances now favoring no penalty rates after the end of this year.
