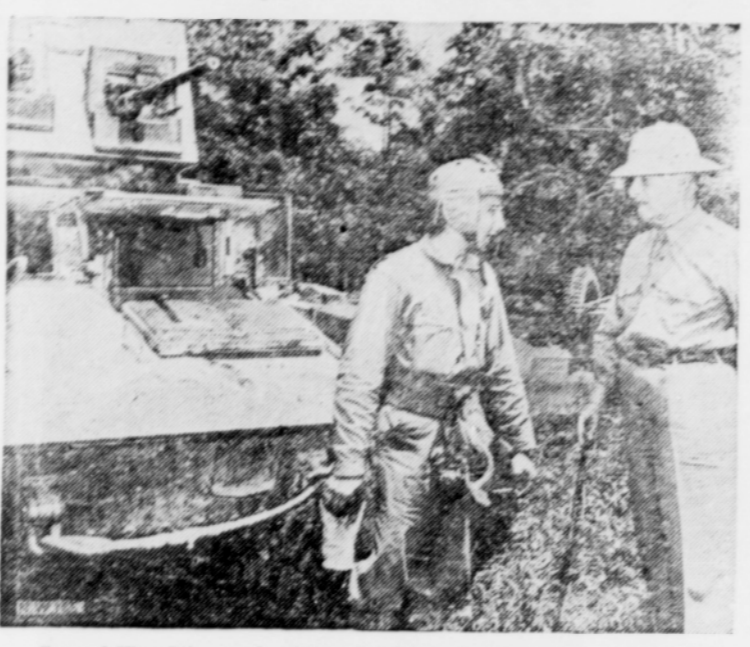

War Secretary Sees Great Tank Battle

She went to a life insurance company and found that the average height of American women is five feet, three inches. She also learned that every fourth woman in the United States is over five feet and six inches.

Then she went to manufacturers to find what arrangements she could make about clothes. Meantime, she held onto her job. The more she learned, the more she felt she had a real idea.

She began to shop for a location. She decided to take an inexpensive one and to tell her customers that she was putting her rent saving into good materials. At last, she found a place on the second floor of a downtown building. Customers would have to walk up, but she could save money for them.

She signed a lease, put down about all the money she had and opened the first clothes shop for tall girls. One hundred and fifteen dresses. No more. The first day she did not make a single sale.

She wrote her own ads and mailed them. Word got around. Customers began to climb the steps.

Business picked up. She is prospering.

I asked her to give me four important rules that tall girls should observe in order to look smart.

1. Don't be sensitive about your height. Remember that height is your asset; make the most of it.
2. Dramatize your height.
3. Wear one large piece of costume jewelry, or carry a large handbag.
4. Wear high heels, if the costume calls for dressy shoes. Low heels may make you look half an inch shorter, but the general effect will not be good.

MOTOR VEHICLE SALES SHOW INCREASE
Motor vehicle sales during the first six months of 1941 showed an increase of 52 per cent over sales for the same period last year in Oregon, figures compiled by the Secretary of State disclosed today.

Sales of new passenger cars and trucks totaled 33,120 units, an increase of 11,339 over the total for the first six months of 1940. Sales of new passenger cars amounted to 28,027 units compared to 18,015 last year while new truck sales totaled 5,095 units against 3,766 last year.

Passenger car sales thus were up 35.7 percent while truck sales were up 26 percent.

ernor Charles A. Sprague, of Oregon, has accepted Honorary Chairmanship of his State Committee for organization of the National Defense Savings Program.

This brings to twenty-six the number of Governors who are already serving in the program to sell Defense Savings Bonds and Stamps.

Governor Sprague was born at Lawrence, Kansas, November 12, 1887. On graduating from Monmouth (Ill.) College in 1910 he became a school teacher. From 1910 to 1913 he was Superintendent of Schools at Waukegan, Washington, then served as Assistant Superintendent of Public Instruction, State of Washington, from 1913 to 1915.

Entering the newspaper field, Mr. Sprague was editor and publisher of the Journal Times, Ritzville, Washington from 1915 to 1925. He became publisher of the Oregon Statesman, Salem, Oregon, in 1929, and was elected Governor of Oregon in November, 1938, for a four-year term.
