"Putting up a taste of summer to flavor next winter's meals";

that is what many a thrifty homemaker is doing these days. By means of tin cans or glass jars she is busy keeping surplus garden stuff from going to waste and canning for the use of her family during the winter.

The importance of a well-balanced canning program cannot be emphasized too strongly, says M. Irene Leach, home demonstration agent. Survey after survey has shown that home canning as a part of wise home produce program can make the difference between diets that are poor and that are good from the standpoint of nutrition. Home produced, home canned food helps provide better diets with fewer food dollars. How much to can is often a question that puzzles the homemaker. In order to supply the needed food during the winter months the homemaker should can the following amounts for each person in her family for one year:

Thirty quarts tomatoes; 25 quarts green vegetables such as peas, beans, asparagus, spinach; eight quarts other vegetables such as beets, corn; 55 quarts of a variety of fruits; three quarts of jellies; six quarts of pickles.

A homemaker would find a yearly record of her canning helpful in determining the exact needs of her individual family.

Always a busy canning time, August this year should be busier than ever in view of the nationwide campaign to save food for emergency needs. In nearly every locality supplies of vegetables go

MORE MEN NEEDED IN AIRCRAFT FACTORIES

Mr. Joe T. Longfellow in a recent interview stated that more men are needed in the Aircraft factories on the Pacific Coast. All men who can furnish birth certificates and are 18 to 45 years old, and are able to meet the requirements of the National Defense Training Program, should apply to their local Employment Service for information concerning this course of training. The local Employment Service is located in the Court House, Oregon City, Oregon, Room 8. The placements in this phase of the National Defense Industries are quite high, there are now approximately 300 men from Oregon City and surrounding towns in Clackamas County now working at Boeing Aircraft Company, Seattle, Wn., Lockheed, Los Angeles, Cal., Columbia, Portland, Oregon.

Thirty men have just been placed with the Boeing Company this last week. The men who have just been sent to Boeing did not finish the required number of hours, but were employed regardless of their lack of training. This is to give the reader some idea as to the vital need of partially trained men in the Aircraft factories. Planes and more planes should be the battle cry of all young men on the streets today. To do this they will have to be trained, so sign up with this program and go to work in the Aircraft Industries. The classes are being held at the old Canemaha Grade School in Oregon City.

There are both night and day classes and the hours for these classes are 7:00 a. m. to 2:30 p. m. and from 6:00 p. m. to 10:00 p. m. Register at once. This will most certainly be a great benefit to you, and as the people in Great Britain say "Keep 'Em Flying."
