### NOTED CHARACTER TO VISIT PORTLAND

A wooden dummy and not a visiting concert artist will be the leading figure in the final pro-

gram of the midsummer night symphony series to be given in Multnomah civic stadium next Monday night, (August 25).

Ventriloquist Edgar Bergen and his hand-carved partner, Charlie McCarthy, leading radio comedians for the past five years, have been billed as guest artists by Paul Lemay, director of the 81-piece summer symphony orchestra. Though the extent of the Bergen-McCarthy "musical" participation in the final concert has not been divulged, Director Lemay has scheduled a full musical program to accompany their appearance.

Bergen, who built the wooden personality of Charlie McCarthy up to a point where it is one of the best-known and most widely-quoted in the entertainment world, is making one of his infrequent personal appearances. His career began with church, club and lodge engagements, turned to the vaudeville stage and later night clubs, but it was only when he turned Charlie McCarthy into the wise-cracking, precociously-sophisticated character now known to millions of radio listeners that his rise to the top in the entertainment field began.

Monday's performance concluded the series of six concerts offered this season by the Summer Symphony fund and will open at 8:30 p. m. All previous concerts this season have set larger attendance records than ever before, and Director Lemay predicts that the Bergen-McCarthy appearance will bring a larger audience than any other program given this season.
