NO MASS-PRODUCTION DOCTORS

No group is working harder for American defense than private medicine. Doctors by the thousands have entered the military service. Selectees for our great new army are examined by local doctors who receive no payments whatsoever. The American Medical Association has pledged its fullest cooperation, and its members are fulfilling that pledge.

However, out of justice to the public, the medical fraternity must oppose proposals which it believes would have a dangerous effect on the national health. In a recent editorial, the A. M. A. Journal says, "It should not be necessary to argue that a continuing and undiminished supply of well-trained physicians is absolutely essential to the welfare of

the nation. We cannot spend up that training beyond a certain point without lowering educational standards and degrading the quality of medical service. The present crisis demands, in fact, better qualified physicians if we are to face the future with reasonable confidence."

Doctors cannot be turned out like machines, on a mass-production basis. To substantially reduce the length of time given to medical training would have far-reaching effects on the public health in the future. This country has the finest physicians in the world—and the main reason is that it has the finest schools of medicine. Unless the strictest standards of medical training continue to prevail, the health of this nation cannot help but suffer severely.

MEN OF FINANCE

In these days of strife and confusion it would do us all good to scrutinize a little closer the history of the United States. Most of us have a general idea that it was a hardy though simple business to create a new nation. It was hardy, but far from simple. Between the written lines of history in which political and military battles predominate, is the intricate story of the growth of an economic system. Each new development in this system took place to meet a definite need. When the great trek westward began a hundred years ago, countless thousands of people invaded millions of square miles of wilderness. When they reached their destination a great majority of them had nothing with which to begin life. In Oklahoma when the famous Cherokee strip was opened to the mad rush of land-hungry settlers, many found themselves stranded and penniless with little more than the clothes on their backs. They were unable to buy the plows, teams, harness, seed, lumber, food, and other necessities that enterprising merchants shipped across the prairies, until other enterprising individuals came with funds to loan to the settlers.

The latter were as essential as the sheriff with his long-barreled Colt. And in a sense they were equally as daring. Few communities or farming centers could have been developed without the local banker who, with dreams of a future for his district, backed worthy citizens in need of financial assistance.

There is far too strong a tendency to deprecate the men of finance. This country could not have been built without them, and it most assuredly will have no free and independent future without the continued operation of private financial institutions. The

sooner we all understand that fact, the more rapidly will we forge ahead as a nation.

STATE NEWS...

Truck and bus owners in Oregon were urged today to make complete returns this week in the national defense truck and bus inventory launched last week, in a statement from Earl Snell, Secretary of State and Oregon chairman of the Highway Traffic Advisory Committee to the war department. Mr. Snell's office is handling the survey for this state. Questionnaire cards were sent out last week to owners of trucks and buses in this state. Owners are asked to give the information sought in the survey and place the cards in the mail immediately.

Purpose of the inventory, according to Snell, is to set up detailed central and regional records of all trucks, busses and freight trailers in the country. With the aid of these records, plans will be developed for more effective use of highway transportation in the assembly of defense-industry materials, delivery of military and civilian supplies, relief of dock and terminal congestion, and movement of passenger traffic in emergencies.

Oregon has approximately 65,000 vehicles which are included in the types of vehicles for which information is sought in the survey. The owner of each vehicle has been asked to report its make, capacity, kind of body, time of year the vehicle is most urgently needed by the owner and whether in an emergency he would be willing to lease or hire the vehicle to the government.

Owners who have received these cards but who have not yet filled them out and returned them are urged to do so at once in the interest of furthering the nation's defense effort, Snell declared.
