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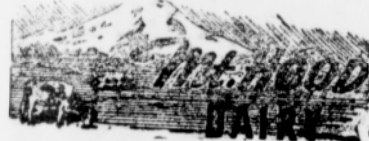

"TRAILER VAGABOND"

Portland, Oregon

Portland, Oregon, is probably the only city in the world with a battleship all its own.

This prized possession distinguished herself in the Spanish-American War, was long the flagship of our navy and led our famous "White Fleet" around the world when Teddy Roosevelt sent that armada out to display the might of the U. S. A., thereby delaying the outbreak of World War No. 1 for many years.

This valiant old "Oregon" isn't moored in the heart of the city because Portland needs private naval protection. Things couldn't be more peaceful around her now, the flowers of the annual Rose Festival having been swept off the streets and riotous Fleet Week over with months ago. No, the battleship's presence is non-belligerent. She is permanently tied up in the Willamette River at one end of Hawthorne Bridge because, in 1925, Uncle Sam gave her to the State she was named for.

The ship now serves a double purpose. A well-stocked naval museum during the day for what appeared to be a very interested public when we strolled the decks of the old dreadnaught, she is also a club-house for the Boy, Girl and Sea Scouts of Portland. Each group has appointed evenings on which to gather aboard the ship and part of the "Oregon's" galley is still in operation to supply late evening snacks for the youngsters.

The Scouts have kept the vessel in excellent condition—paintwork gleaming, brickwork glittering, guns and machinery well oiled and ready for action that will come no more. The Scouts have their assigned battle-stations and proud is the lad who is Gun Captain to one of the 5 or 11 inch cannon that roared victoriously at the Spanish Fleet in '98.

Launched at Bremerton, Washington, in 1895, the "Oregon" made a record dash around the Horn three years later to join our Atlantic Fleet against the Spanish. In 47 days she plowed through 15,000 miles of oceans, arriving off Santiago, Cuba, just in time to engage in the decisive naval battle of the war.

By sinking the "Merrimac" across the mouth of Santiago's harbor, our fleet had bottled up the reputedly unbeatable Spanish force. Only a narrow exit remained, 600 Marines landed to close in for the kill. The Spaniards had to fight, surrender or flee through that little channel.

Early on the morning of July 3rd the Spanish warships attempted to slip away to freedom. They were met by our force and the battle was on. The panting "Oregon" hove in sight at that moment and joined the fray. She bombarded and fired the Spanish flagship, "Maria Teresa," and ran her ashore. She then chased the "Colon" 48 miles before running her aground for capture. The Spaniards were licked.

As Dewey had things well under control in the Philippines by this time, the Spanish-American War practically ended with the Battle of Santiago—with the "Oregon" playing a stellar role.

Still serving her country, the "Oregon" is now training the youth of Portland to accept responsibility and do a job well.
