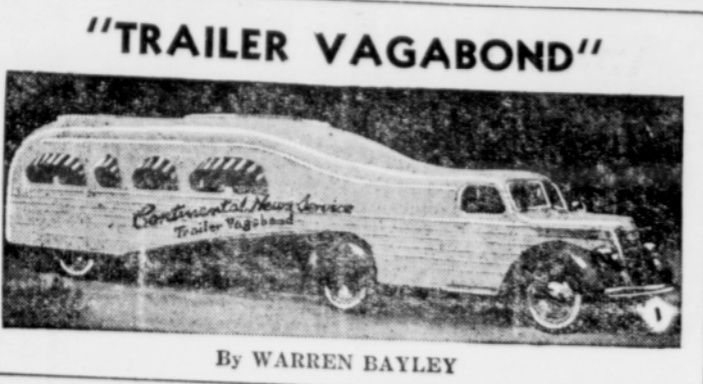

Crater Lake, Oregon
Genial Mr. R. W. Price bought Crater Lake Lodge, sight unseen, twenty-one years ago. Since then he has built a dinky hotel into a beautiful resort and has raised a family of four daughters and five small grand-children on the side. To look upon the man's beaming countenance is to know that both tasks were a pleasure. In his mind he was taking no gamble back in 1920. He foresaw the growth of Southern Oregon's tourist business. He also wanted to get off into the wilds. The tiny lodge that was catering to a bare 16,000 visitors a year has grown to a huge, rambling structure of gleaming stone and many gables. It welcomed a quarter-million guests last season.

Those guests came here to view a most spectacular lake—the deepest on the North American Continent and the 4th deepest in the world, filling the yawning remains of a gigantic volcano that blew up and collapsed 5,000 years ago. Crater Lake is so blue you don't believe it, probably due to its 2,000 foot depth. It has no known outlet but seepage and yet is more pure than Ivory Soap's famed 99 44-100 per cent. Fed by 53 feet of snow annually, or 73 inches of precipitation, its evaporation and supply balance so perfectly that the lake's 26 miles of shore line never rises or falls more than three feet. Because of its great depth and in spite of heavy snow falls, the lake never freezes over.

Discovered in 1853, Crater Lake is incorporated into the 250-square-mile National Park created in 1902 and bearing its name. Its 6,164 feet of elevation is but HALF the height of the towering mountain that blew up and caved in to form the hollow now filled with brilliantly blue water. Multi-colored and partly forested volcanic cliffs and peaks rim the lake and rise high above its cobalt surface.

There was no "Rim Drive" back in 1907 when the first automobile chugged its way up here but you can now enjoy some wonderful views from the Drive's 35 miles of wandering length. Without a license you can catch the present-day relatives of fish first placed in the lifeless lake in 1888. You can clearly see a trout nibble at your hook 100 feet down in water as clear as air. The first boat to render launch service on the lake splashed into its blue waters in 1907. Now there are all kinds of boats at hand for hire and a daily sight-seeing cruise is very popular.

The lake itself is best viewed in summer and fall, although the park is open the year around at its south and east entrances. Accommodations are best in the summer, of course, and you can choose between free camp grounds, neat little cabins or the impressive Lodge, the center of most activity, perched a thousand feet above the lake.

Mr. Price not only picked an excellent site for a business venture but selected one of the most beautiful places to call "home" at the same time, even though that extensive "home" is generally filled with the bustle and confusion of a few thousand guests.
