NOTICE OF SCHOOL ELECTION UPON QUESTION OF INCREASING TAX LEVY OVER AMOUNT LIMITED BY SECTION 11, ARTICLE XI, STATE CONSTITUTION

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in School District No. 46 of Clackamas County, State of Oregon at Schoolhouse June 15, 1942-8 P.M. in said school district, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the year 1943 over the amount limited by section 11, article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levies are: Delinquent taxes and changing tax year.
The amount of tax, in excess of the 6 per cent limitation, proposed to be levied for said year is \$5100.64.

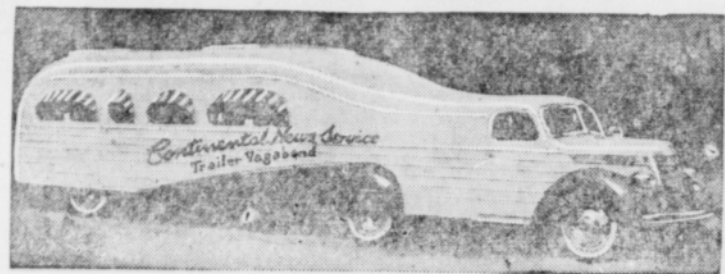

"TRAILER VAGABOND"

Meramec Caverns, Stanton, Mo. If you live in the middle west — plan on visiting Missouri now or in the future — want to see a bit of fairyland on which nature has been at work for some 70 million years — then make a mental note of the point of interest described in this column and don't fail to visit Meramec Caverns some 55 miles west of St. Louis. It is the world's only story cave.

There is more than a passing chance that you have never heard of this scenic attraction. Until a few years ago it was just another cave on a single level. In 1933, 1939 and again in 1942 additional rooms were discovered; it's these discoveries that have brought the caverns into the national spotlight and given it the greatest percentage of increase in visitors of any cave.

In these rooms were found many of the most beautiful formations never before seen by man. Onyx mountain — the world's largest stalagmite—over 200 feet in diameter. The Wine Room—lifelike bunches of grapes hang from the walls of this room and in the center nature has fashioned a perfect

table complete with bottles and glasses. Stage Curtains—this is considered to be the most beautiful formation of its kind in the world. The room is shaped like a theater and the entire stage is draped in Onyx curtains that hang completely to the floor.

The caverns were originally formed millions of years ago when the plains of southern Missouri and northern Arkansas wrinkled their brow and formed the Ozark Mountains. The Indians knew of its existence and led the first white man to its mouth in 1735. In 1760 the first floor was used as a base for the first lead mine in Missouri. During the Civil war it was used as a gun powder plant and later as a station on the underground railroad. Several hundred slaves received their freedom by this route.

During the 1870's it became a special rendezvous for Jesse James and his band. As the mouth of the caverns is large and level (recently 1500 soldiers from Fort Leonard Wood marched thru the opening in formation) James and his men could dash into cover on horseback on the dead run. The pursuing

posse was at a great disadvantage because it was in the light while the bandits were covered by a curtain of darkness. It was James' escape thru an unknown passage after a three day siege that led to the recent exploration work which revealed the many formations that now cause visitors to gasp in wonder.

In the gay 90's dances were held 500 feet back in the cave. Recently the custom has been resumed. Each Saturday night thru-out the summer the sound of drums and trumpets echo from formations that were millions of years old when Christ was born. But—you don't have to be a jitterbug to enjoy Meramec Caverns. The sights you will see are something you will remember forever.

It's a "must see" in the "show me" state.

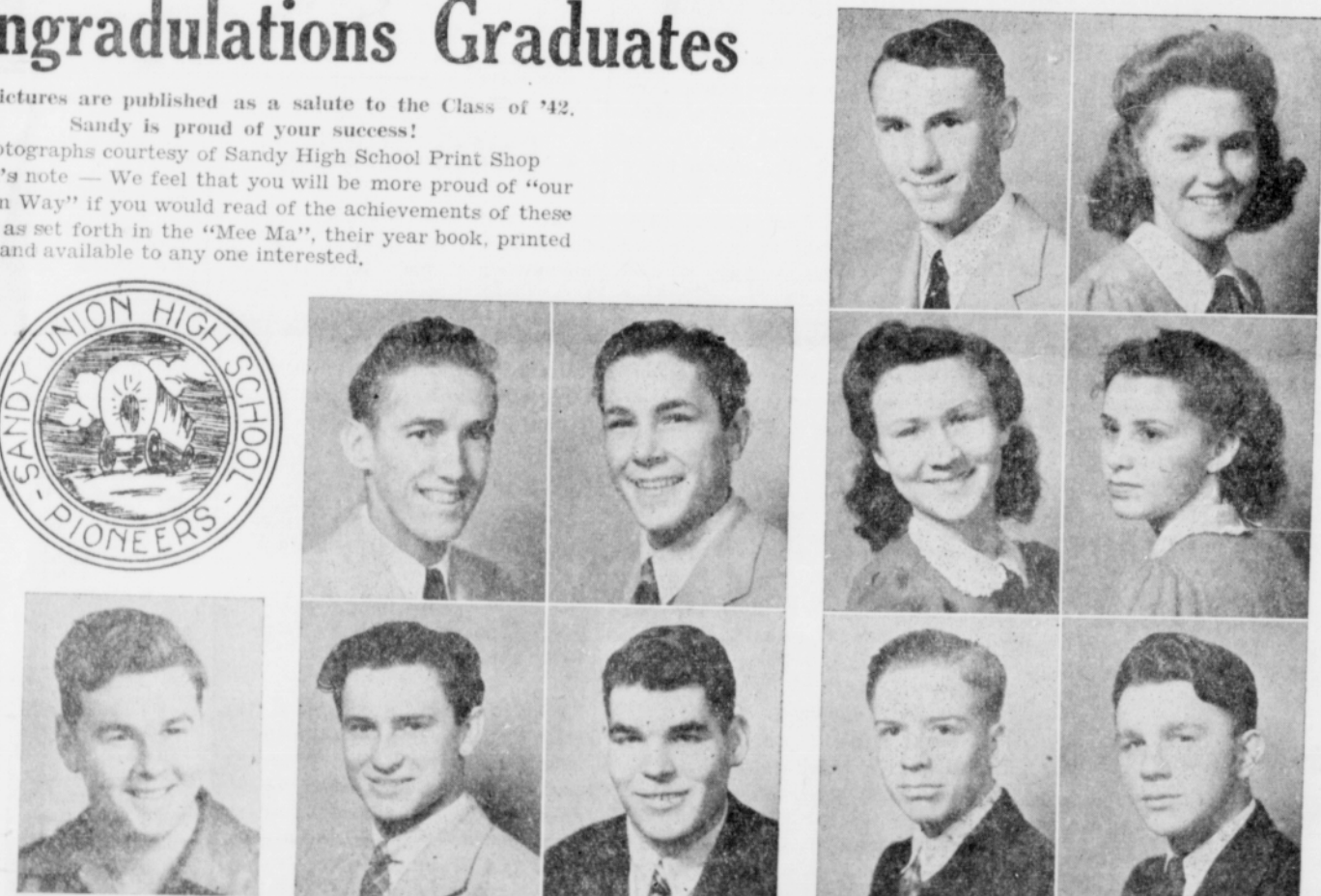
