are completely up in the air.

Concerning this, the Portland Oregonian recently said, "There is a war need that every kilowatt of energy available be conserved and put to economical use—War does not suspend its demands upon the country's power and fuel supply—while public ownership of public utilities is debated and decided upon." The destroyers of private enterprise are establishing an adieu precedent which would make possible the planned destruction of any business. The fact that an adequate supply of electric power may thus be imperiled does not deter them in the slightest. Hitler must chuckle when his agents bring him news of the drive to hamstring private industries in the United States which are essential to war production.
